the next Convoy to the Morea,

Warfaw, March 14. The Court of Poland, which is at present at Zolkieu, is expected here against the middle of the next Month, but the King will make no long stay in this City, his Majesty intending to be in the Rield at the Head of his Army before the end of May. All our Advices from Moltswy affure us, that very extraordinary Preparations are making for the profecution of the War on that fide, and that they will begin the Campagne wery early; And there are particular Letters from Bialacerkieu, which say they had prepared a Train of Artillery of 200 pieces of Cannon. The News of which, as we are told from the Frontiers, has greatly starmed the Tartars, who had perfuaded themselves that the Czars would never have been prewailed with to join in this War with the Crown of Poland; And the Cham has written to the Grand Visier to let him know, that instead of employing his Troops in conjunction with those of the Grand Signier against the Poles, he shall now stand in need of affiftance from the Port to defend his Territories against the Moscovites, who are preparing to invade them with a very great Army. The last Letters from Lemberg informed us, that several Tartars who had been taken Prisomers in a Rencounter some Polish Troops had lately with the Enemy, had been brought to that place, who reported, that the Garifon of Caminiec fur-fered great want of Provisions, the Countrey round it being so mined, that they could draw no Bublittence from thence, and feveral Convoys that had been fent to relieve them having been intercepted by the Poles and Coffacks. These Letters say farther, that the Crown Treasurer was abroad with 3 or 6000 Polish Horse, to keep the Enemy from putting any Succors into Caminiec.

Berlin, March 25. The Elector of Brandenburgh has upon the instances of the Polish Envoy, promised to send some Troops, with several pieces of Cannon, and a confiderable number of Bombs and Grenado's, to the affiftance of that Crown. The last advices from Poland said, the King had ordered his Troops to be at the general Rendezvous before the end of May; and that his Majesty had resolved to keep Caminiec very closely blocked up, while he acted with the main Body of his Forces in concert with the Moseowises; who we are affored from all Hands, will be very strong in the Field the next Sum-

Franciers March 81. The last Letters from Vienua, which are of the 23 Instant, give an account, that the general Rendez-

vous of the Imperial Army is appointed to be the 15th of May, between Buda and Gran; and that there was some discourse of their acting in two diftinct Bodies, one under the Con 1 nd of the Elector of Baveria, and the other of the Duke of Lorgain, but if it betrue, as they write from Turky, that the Grand Signior will appear the next Campagne in Hungary at the head of a very numerous Army; the Imperialifts will then unite all their Forces, to give him Battle. That the Lieutenant Finckenstein had been several times examined by the Governor of Buda; but that he had added nothing of moment to his former Confession, of which you have already had an account. The fame Letters fay, that the Duke of Lorrain was expected at Vienna the beginning of the next Month.

Hamburgh, April 1. The Letters from Dresden tell us, that the Elector of Saxomy has promised to affist the Emperor with 4000 Men the next Campagne. are told from Berlin, that his Imperial Majesty desires the like Succor of the Elector of Brandenburgh. They write from Copenbagen, that Preparations are making there for the King's Journey to Holftein.

Hague, April A. Prince Waldecke parted from hence the last week for Cuylenburg, where he intends to stay some time. The States of Friesland have consented to the state of the War for this present year, Prince Casimir of Nassau, Stadtholder of Friesland and Groningen, returned the 2d of this month to Leenwaerden.
