No. 573.—The 2nd Battalion Military Train is under orders for immediate embarkation for England.

The career in India of this Corps has been short, but brilliant, and eminently serviceable to its country.

Upon arriving at the presidency, it was at once converted into a cavalry force, and sent untrained into the field.

Throughout the glorious campaign in Oude, the Military Train bore a part which would have reflected credit upon the oldest and most experienced cavalry soldiers.

It has served with distinction in various affairs under Lieutenant-General Sir James Outram, at the capture of Lucknow, in the operations about Azinghur, and lastly in the harassing campaign of Shahabad.

The Military Train leaves India with the best wishes of the Viceroy and Governor-General in Council, for the future honour and prosperity of the Battalion.

A salute will be fired from the guns of Fort William on the departure of the corps.

Whereas We have thought it expedient, for divers good causes and considerations, that a Commission should forthwith issue that enquiries may be made by Our Commissioners into the present state, condition, and sufficiency, of the Fortifications existing for the Defence of Our United Kingdom, and of examining into all works at present in progress, for the improvement thereof, and for considering the most effectual means of rendering the same complete, especially all such Works of Defence as are intended for the protection of Our Royal Arsenals and Dockyards, in case of any hostile attack being made by foreign enemies both by sea and land.

Now know ye, that We, reposing great trust and confidence in your zeal, knowledge, and ability, have authorized and appointed, and do by these presents authorize and appoint you, the said Sir Harry David Jones, Duncan Alexander Cameron, George Elliot, Sir Frederick Abbott, Astley Cooper Key, John Henry Lefroy, and James Fergusson, or any five or more of you, to be Our Commissioners, for the purpose of such enquiries as aforesaid, and that you may offer such suggestions as may seem to you meet as (regard being had to the works completed and in progress, and to the ordinary number of Our Royal Artillery, voted by Parliament), will render Our United Kingdom in a complete state of defence.

And for the better enabling you to carry these Our Royal intentions into effect, We do hereby

authorize and empower you, or any five or more of you, to call for, have access to, and examine all plans, designs, estimates, and contracts for all works of defence now in progress or under Our consideration, or any other plans or designs that may be laid before you for the same object.

And We do give and grant to you, or any five or more of you, full power and authority to call before you such persons in Our Civil, Military, or Naval Services, as you shall judge likely to afford you the best and fullest information upon the subject of this Our Commission, and to enquire of and concerning the premises by all other lawful ways and means whatsoever.

And We do, by these presents, will and ordain, that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you, Our said Commissioners, or any five or more of you, may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof, and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment.

And Our further will and pleasure is, that you, Our said Commissioners, or any five or more of you, upon due inquiry into the premises, do report to Us, in writing, under your hands and seals, your several proceedings, under and by virtue of this Commission, together with what you shall find touching or concerning the premises.

And We further ordain, that you, or any five or more of you, may have liberty to report to Us your proceedings under this Commission from time to time, should you judge it expedient so to do.

And for your assistance in the due execution of these presents We have made choice of Our trusty and well-beloved William Francis Drummond Jervis, a Captain in Our Corps of Royal Engineers and Major in Our Army, to be Secretary to this Our Commission, and to attend you, whose services and assistance We require you to avail yourselves of from time to time as occasion may require.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade and Plantations have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at St. Petersburg, transmitting the following translation of an Imperial

Ukase which has been issued, reducing the duty on Foreign Iron imported into Russia.

UKASE OF HIS IMPERIAL MAJESTY THE EMPEROR OF ALL THE RUSSIAS TO THE SENATE.

In accordance with the Ukase of His Imperial Majesty, the Senate gave hearing to the Report of the Minister of Finance, dated the 19th June, 1859, No. 9386, to which is annexed a copy of the opinion of the Council of State (confirmed by His Majesty on the 16th of June last), respecting the reduction of import duty on foreign, wrought, and cast iron. In the said opinion of the Council of State, it is stated:—The Council of State, in the Department of Economy, at the General Meeting, at its General Meeting having considered the proposal of the Minister of Finance respecting the reduction of import duty on foreign, wrought, and cast iron, gave their opinion; that:—

1st.—That cast and wrought iron not made up, arriving direct into the Empire, either by land or sea, in every place except the ports of the Sea of Azoff, to be subject to the following duties:—

	Copecks.
Cast iron in a raw state	5 per pood.
Wrought iron:	
Bay, rail, and scrap iron	35 ditto.
Assorted iron	45 ditto.
Boiler, plate, sheet, and cube iron	70 ditto.

2nd.—The import of foreign, cast, and wrought iron direct from abroad into the ports of the Sea of Azoff to remain for the present prohibited; and

3rd.—The existing duties on these metals, as per tariff of 1857, for the Kingdom of Poland, to remain in force in that kingdom for the present, without modification.

On the original opinion of the Council of State it is written: His Imperial Majesty having considered the opinion of Council of State, with reference to the reduction of the import duties on cast and wrought iron, deigned to confirm and order its execution.
