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Rome, March 22.

TH E Pope gave yesterday a long Audience to the Cardinal d' Eſtrez, who acquainted his Holineſs with the Declaration which the Moſt Chriſtian King had made, that he will Religiouſly obſerve the Truce, and maintain a good correſpondence with the Emperor and the Empire. Signior Imperiale Treafurer of the Chamber is returned from *Civita Vecchia*, where he had been to give Orders for the fitting out his Holineſſes Gallies, which are to ſerve againſt the *Turks* this Summer.

Venice, April 4. We have received this week, Letters from *Napoli di Romania*, which give an Account, That *Sabau Aga* was arrived in the *Morea* from *Conſtantinople*, with Orders from the Grand Signior for the removing *Iſhmael Baſſa* from the Command of Seraſquier of his Forces in the *Morea*, and the eſtabliſhing in his place, *Mahomet Baſſa* a Perſon of very ſmall Experience in Military Affairs; And that the *Turks* do fortify *Negrepoint*, and ſeveral Poſts in the *Morea*. The *Grecian* Metropolitan of *Napoli di Malvoſia*, is fled hither, fearing the *Turks*, for that they ſuſpected him of holding Correſpondence with the Officers of the Republick. The next week 12 Men of War will ſet Sail with part of the new raiſed Troops, the Money, and Proviſions for the *Morea*, and the other Ships will follow with the reſt of the Troops which are daily expected. An Expreſs arrived here ſome days ago from *Brunſwicke*, with an Account, That the 2600 Men, which the Duke of *Hanouer* has promiſed to ſend to the Aſſiſtance of the Republick, were ready to begin their march; And that beſides theſe, his Highneſs had cauſed Levies to be made for the recruiting the *Lunenburgh* Forces that are already in the Service of this State.

Dantzick, April 5. The Letters from *Craſow* of the 23d of the laſt Month tell us, that the Crown-General having received advice, that *Sultan Galga* had paſſed the *Boriftenez* with a Body of *Tartars*, to conduct a new Baſſa, and a great Convoſ of Proviſions to *Caminnic*, he had ſent out a detachment of 5000 Horſe and Dragoons to joyn the Troops quartered on the Frontiers, in order to oppoſe the Enemies paſſage. That the *Moscovites* made great proviſion of Forage in their Frontier places, for the ſubſiſtence of their Cavalry; That they continued their preparations for the Campaign with extraordinary application; That the Sieur *ſamuelowitz* was already at the head of 100000 *Coffacks*; and that it was believed, the deſign of the *Moscovites* was to begin the War with the attack of *Ozowa*, a very ſtrong Fortreſs ſituate on the Frontiers of the *Crim Tartary*, in which the *Turks* have a Garifon. The

Court of *Poland* was according to our laſt advice ſtill at *Zolkiew*, but intended to remove from thence after the *Eaſter* Holidays to *Warsaw*.

Vienna, April 3. On Saturday laſt the *Moscovite* Ambaſſadors had their firſt Conference with the Emperor's Commiſſioners, who are Prince *Herman* of *Baden*, Preſident of the Council of War, the Count *de Strarman* Great Chancellor of the Court, the Baron *Herwart*, the Baron *Zierousky*, formerly his Imperial Majeſties Envoy to the King of *Poland* and the Czars of *Moscovy*, and the two Secretaries of War. In this Conference, which was held in one of the Apartments of the Palace, the operations of the approaching Campaign were chiefly treated of; and it's ſaid, the Ambaſſadors declared, that the Czars their Maſters intend to attack the *Crim Tartary* with 500000 Men, divided in ſeveral Bodies. The 1ſt Inſtant the Biſhop of *Primilia*, Ambaſſador from the King of *Poland*, arrived here to aſſiſt at the Conſultations that will be held about the proſecution of the War. They write from *Eſperies*, that General *Caraffa* had drawn detachments out of the ſeveral Garifons in *Upper Hungary*, in order to ſome conſiderable Enterprize. And by Letters from *Segedin* we are informed that the *Turks*, *Tartars*, and Rebels, who had aſſembled near *Temefwaer*, to the number of 7000 Men, were on their march towards the *Theyſſe*; ſo that we are expecting to hear of ſome action on that ſide. We have advice of the arrival of another Convoſ of 900 Wagons with Proviſions at *Five Churches*, which was ſent from *Croatia*; and that that Garifon is now abundantly provided with all things neceſſary for their ſubſiſtence. We have no freſh Letters from *Buda*; but expect to hear by our next, what farther Confeſſion the Lieutenant *Finckenſlein* has made upon his being put to the Torture; Half of the Regiment of *Nagrells* has been ſent to reinforce that Garifon. We have an account from *Croatia* that Count *Francis Erdeudi* having made an incurſion into the Enemies Territories with 300 Horſe and 400 Foot of the Militia of that Country advanced the 17th of the laſt Month near to the Caſtle of *Pedag* on the River *Unna*, where he lay his Men in Ambuſh, and detached a ſmall party of Horſe towards *Zrin* and *Noui*; The *Turks* of thoſe Garifons taking the Alarm, ſallied out, and purſued the *Croats*, who drew them into the Ambuſh, where they were very ill treated, moſt of them being cut in pieces; and *Mahomet Aga*, with ſome other conſiderable Officers being taken priſoners: In this action a great many *Valachians* were joyned with the *Turks*, and theſe maintained their ground the laſt. In their return the *Croats* to revenge the death of ſome Officers of conſideration among them, who were killed in this occaſion, fell upon the priſoners, and ſlew the greateſt part of them.

Vienna, April 6. The Duke of *Lorraine* is expected here this week from *Inſpruck*, after whoſe arrival we ſhall be able to ſpeak with more certainty

ty of the designs of the Campagne. The Prince de Lubomirski, Great Marechal of Poland, returned hither some days ago from Italy, and started again yesterday for Poland. The 4th Instant the Moscovite Ambassadors had another Conference with the Imperial Commissioners, to which they were conducted in the Emperor's Coaches in the same manner as was observed at their first. They do assure the Emperor, that the Czars their Masters will act vigorously, and in Concert with the Princes engaged in the present League; and that they will invade the Territories of the Cham of Tartary, with very numerous Armies, and intend at the same time to attack the places which the Turks are now possessed of on the Boristenes, that so the Cossacks may have nothing to hinder them from making their Incursons into the Black Sea. An Express was sent three days ago to General Caraffa, with the resolution of this Court concerning the farther Proceedings against the Accomplishes in the Conspiracy lately discovered in Upper Hungary. We have an account from thence, that the Turks and Tartars, who, we told you in our last, were marching towards the Theysse, had advanced to Chomad, a small Town situated on the River Marosch, and secured by a very strong Castle, which they attacked, but that, after being three days before the place, they retired with great Precipitation, upon the Advice they received, that the Imperialists of the Neighbouring Garisons were drawing together to relieve it! The Hungarian Officer, who commanded at Chomad, behaved himself extremely well, and though he had a very small Garison, repulsed the Enemy several times with considerable loss on their side. It's certain that General Caraffa has resolv'd on some considerable Enterprize, and that the Troops in Upper Hungary are drawing together, but 'tis not yet known what the design is. We have Advice that a Turkish Aga is arriv'd at Debrezin with a Train of several Persons, and that he desired to be conducted to General Caraffa, who was then at Esperies, being charged with a Letter for him from the Grand Visier; We shall know, in a few days, what the Business is he is sent upon. They write from Gran, that they were inform'd by some Countrey People who had been at Alba Regalis, that 800 Spahis and Janisaries were lately sent from thence, who were to join with other Parties of Sigeth and Canisfa, to incommode the Imperial Garisons of Fiva Churches and Siclos, but both these places being very well provided, we cannot believe the Turks will venture to make any attempt upon them. Here is arriv'd a Religious from Persia, with several Letters for the Emperor, which, it's said, give an account of the resolution of the Sophy to enter into a War against the Turks.

Hamburg, April 11. The death of Prince Louis, Margrave of Brandenburg, Second Son of the Elector of Brandenburg, who dyed at Postdam the 7th Instant, has extremely afflicted his Electoral Highness, and that whole Court. He was Married to the Princess Radzville, Daughter and Heiress of Prince Radzville of Poland.

Brussels, April 11. Our Governour-General is gone to pass some days at Terveuren. The account we have as well from Vienna as Poland, of the preparations the Moscovites are making for the prosecution of the War against the Turks and Tartars, seems incredible; They say the Czars will have 500 000 Men in the Field this next Campagne, and a Train of Artillery of 3 or 400 pieces of Cannon. The Duke of Lorrain was expected the last week at Vienna, where a great Council of War was then intended to be held, to fix the time for the general Rendezvous, and to order all other matters for the

opening of the Campagne. They write from Upper Hungary, that General Caraffa understanding that 7000 Turks and Tartars were moving towards the Theysse, had caused a strong detachment of his Troops to advance that way, to fight them.

Brussels, April 18. Our Governour returned yesterday from Terveuren. His Excellency has given Orders for the reinforcing the Garisons of Mons and Namur. The Letters from Vienna tell us, that the Turks have brought together vast quantities of Provisions at Belgrade and Essecke for the subsistence of their Army, which they still give out the Grand Signior will command in Person; And that the Turks and Tartars, who had attacked Chomad retired, so soon as they heard that the Imperialists were advancing towards them. The Emperor's Minister at the Court of Brandenburg has not yet concluded the Treaty he is Negotiating about the Succors his Imperial Majesty demands of that Elector.

Hague, April 18. Prince Philip of Brandenburg is preparing upon the news of the death of Prince Louis his Brother, to return home. They write from Francfort of the 9th Instant, that the Comde de Villar Mayor, Ambassador Extraordinary from the King of Portugal to the Elector Palatine, intended to continue in that City 10 days or a Fortnight, in which time his Equipage would be ready.

Paris, April 19. The King is gone to Maintenon, from whence he will return on Wednesday next. His Majesty's Journey to Luxemburg, is fix'd for the first of the next month. The Marquis d'Angou is perfectly recovered of his late Illness, and is returned to Court.
