Venice, April 4. We have received this week, Letters from Napoli di Romania, which give an Account, That Sabau Aga was arrived in the Morea from Constantincple, with Orders from the Grand Signior for the removing Islomael Bassa from the Command of Serasquier of his Forces in the Morea, and the establishing in his place, Mahomea Bassa a Person of very small Experience in Military Affairs; And that the Turks do fortify Negrepone, and feveral Posts in the Morea. The Grecian Metro-politan of Napoli di Malvasia, is fled hither, fearing the Turks, for that they suspected him of holding Correspondence with the Officers of the Re-The next week 12 Men of War will fet Sail with part of the new raifed Troops, the Money, and Provisions for the Morea, and the other Ships will follow with the rest of the Troops which are daily expected. An Express arrived here some days ago from Brunspicke, with an Account, That the 2600 Men, which the Duke of Hanouer has promised to fend to the Assistance of the Republick, were ready to begin their march; And that besides these, his Highness had caused Levies to be made for the recruiting the Lunenburgh Forces that are already in the Service of this State.

Dantzick, April 5. The Letters from Cracow of the 23d of the last Month tell us, that the Crown-General having received advice, that Suitan Galga had passed the Boristenes with a Body of Tartars, to conduct a new Bassa, and a great Convoy of Provisions to Caminiec, he had fent out a detachement of 5000 Horse and Dragoons to joyn the Troops quartered on the Frontiers, in order to oppose the Enemies paffage. That the Moscovites made great provision of Forage in their Frontier places, for the sub-sistence of their Cavalry; That they continued their preparations for the Campagne with extraordinary application; That the Sieur Samuelowitz was already at the head of 100000 Cossacks; and that it was believed, the design of the Moscowites was to begin the War with the attack of Ozona, a very Arong Fortress situate on the Frontiers of the Crim Tartary, in which the Turks have a Garison. The arrival we shall be able to speak with more certain-

Vienna, April 3. On Saturday last the Moscovite Ambassadors had their first Conserence with the Emperor's Commissioners, who are Prince Herman of Baden, President of the Council of War, the Count de Straatman Great Chancellor of the Court, the Baron Herwart, the Baron Zierousky, formerly his Imperial Majesties Envoy to the King of Poland and the Czars of Moscovy, and the two Secretaries of War. In this Conference, which was held in one of the Apartments of the Palace, the operations of the approaching Campagne were chiefly treated of; and it's faid, the Ambassadors declared, that the Czars their Masters intend to attack the Crim Tartary with 500 000 Men, divided in several Bodies, The 1st Instant the Bishop of Primilia, Ambassador from the King of Poland, arrived here to affift at the Confultations that will be held about the profecution of the War. They write from Ef-peries, that General Caraffa had drawn detachements out of the several Garisons in Upper Hungary, in order to some considerable Enterprize. Letters from Segedin we are informed that the Turks, Tarears, and Rebels, who had affembled near Temeswaer, to the number of 7000 Men, were on their march towards the Theysta; so that we are expecting to hear of some action on that side. have advice of the arrival of another Convoy of 900 Wagons with Provisions at Five Churches, which was sent from Croating and that that Garison is now abundantly provided with all things necessary for their sublistence. We have no fresh Letters from Buda; but expect to hear by our next, what farther Confession the Lieutenant Finckenstein has made upon his being put to the Torture; Half of the Regiment of Nigrelli has been fent to reinforce that Garison. We have an account from Croatia that Count Francis Erdeudi having made an incursion into the Enemies Territories with 300 Horse and 400 Foot of the Militia of that Country advanced the 17th of the 1ail Month near to the Castle of Pedag on the River Unna, where he lay his Men in Ambush, and detached a small party of Horse towards, Zrin and Noui; The Turks of those Garisons taking the Alberm, fallied out, and purfued the Croats, who drew them into the Ambush, where they were very ill treated, most of them being cut in pieces; and Mahomet Aga, with some other considerable Officers being taken prisoners: In this action a great many Valachians were joyned with the Turks, and these maintained their ground the last. In their return the Croats to revenge the death of some Officers of confideration among them, who were killed in this occasion, fell upon the prisoners, and slew the greatest part of them.

We have an account from thence, that the Turks and Tarears, who, we told you in our laft, were marching towards the Theysse, had advanced to Chonad, a small Town scituated on the River Marosch, and secured by a very strong Castle, which they attacked, but that after being three days before the place, they retired with great Precipitation, upon the Advice they received, that the Imperialists of the Neighbouring Garifons were drawing to-gether to relieve it? The Hungarian Officer, who commanded at Chomad, behaved himself extremely well, and though he had a very small Garison, repulled the Enemy feveral times with confiderable loss on their side. It's certain that General Caraffa has refolved on some considerable Enterprize, and that the Troops in Upper Hungary are drawing together, but 'is not yet known what the delign is.
