Rome, March 22.

H E Pope gave yesterday a long Audience to the Cardinal d' Estrees, who acquainted his Holines with the Declaration which the Most Chriftian King had made, that he will Religiously observe the Truce, and maintain a good correspondence with the Emperor and the Empire. Signior Imperiale Treasurer of the Chamber is returned from Cipita Vecchia, where he had been to give Orders for the fitting out his Holinesses Gallies, which are to ferve against the Turks this Summer.

Venice, April 4. We have received this week, Letters from Napoli di Romanua, which give an Account, That Sabau Aga was arrived in the Morea from Constantincple, with Orders from the Grand Signior for the removing *Ifomael* Baffa from the Command of Serafquier of his Forces in the Morea, and the establishing in his place, Mahomea Bassa a Perfon of very fmall Experience in Military Affairs; And that the Turks do fortify Negrepont, and feveral Posts in the Morea. The Grecian Metro-politan of Napoli di Malvajia, is fled hither, fearing the Turks, for that they inspected him of holding Correspondence with the Officers of the Republick. The next week 12 Men of War will fet Sail with part of the new raifed Troops, the Mo-ney, and Provisions for the Morea, and the other Ships will follow with the reft of the Troops which are daily expected. An Express arrived here fome days ago from Brunfivicke, with an Account, That the 2600 Men, which the Duke of Hanouer has promifed to fend to the Affiltance of the Republick, were ready to begin their march; And that belides these, his Highness had caused Levies to be made for the recruiting the Lunenburgh Forces that are already in the Service of this State.

. Danizick, April 5. The Letters from Cracow of the 23d of the laft Month tell us, that the Crown-General having received advice, that Suitan Galga had paffed the Boriftenes with a Body of Tartars, to conduct a new Baffa, and a great Convoy of Provifions to Caminiec, he had fent out a detachement of 5000 Horfe and Dragoons to joyn the Troops quartered on the Frontiers, in order to oppofe the Enemies paffage. That the Mofcovites made great provision of Forage in their Frontier places, for the tubfiftence of their Cavalry; That they continued their preparations for the Campagne with extraordinary application; That the Sieur Samuelouriez was already at the head of 100000 Coffacks; and that it was believed, the defign of the Mofcovites was to begin the War with the attack of Oxona, a very frong Fortreis fituate on the Frontiers of the Crim Tartary, in which the Turks have a Garifon. The Court of Poland was according to our last advice full at Zolkiem, but intended to remove from thence after the Easter Holidays to Warsam.

Vienna, April 3. On Saturday last the Moscowite Ambassiadors had their first Conference with the Emperor's Commiffioners, who are Prince Herman of Baden, Prefident of the Council of War, the Count de Straatman Great Chancellor of the Court, the Baron Herwart, the Baron Zierousky, formerly his Imperial Majefties Envoy to the King of Poland and the Czars of Moscovy, and the two Secretaries of War. In this Conference, which was held in one of the Apartments of the Palace, the operations of the approaching Campagne were chiefly treated of; and it's faid, the Amballadors declared, that the Czars their Masters intend to attack the Crim Tartary with 500 000 Men, divided in feveral Bo-dies. The 1st Instant the Bishop of Primilia, Ambaffador from the King of Poland, arrived here to affift at the Confultations that will be held about the profecution of the War. They write from Ef-peries, that General Caraffa had drawn detachements out of the feveral Garifons in Upper Hungary, in order to fome confiderable Enterprize. And by Letters from Segedin we are informed that the Turks, Tarears, and Rebels, who had allembled near Temefaraer, to the number of 7000 Men, were on their march towards the They fla; fo that we are expecting to hear of fome action on that fide. We have advice of the arrival of another Convoy of 900 Wagons with Provisions at Five Churches, which was fent from Croating and that that Garifon is now abundantly provided with all things neceffary for their fublistence. We have no fresh Letters from Buda; but expect to hear by our next, what farther Confession the Lieutenant Finckenstein has made upon his being put to the Torture; Half of the Regiment of Nigrelli has been fent to reinforce that Garifon. We have an account from Croatia that Count Francis Erdeudi having made an incursion into the Enemies Territorics with 300 Horfe and 400 Foot of the Militia of that Country advanced the 17th of the laft Month near to the Caffle of Pedag on the River Unna, where he lay his Men in Ambush, and detached a small party of Horse towards Zrin and Noui; The Turks of those Garifons taking the Allarm, fallied out, and purfued the Croats, who drew them into the Ambush, where they were very ill treated, most of them being cut in pieces; and Mahomet Aga, with fome other confiderable Officers being taken prifoners: In this action a great many Valachians were joyned with the Turks, and these maintained their ground the last. In their return the Croats to revenge the death of fome Officers of confideration among them, who were killed in this occasion, fell upon the priloners, and flew the

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
