THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade and Plantations have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Minister at Athens, enclosing a translation of a circular of the Greek Minister of the Interior, revoking the existing sanitary regulations whereby all vessels arriving from Barbary were treated as having foul bills of Health; and providing that in future only the arrivals from the Principality of Tripoli shall be regarded as suspected of plague, and subjected to twelve days' quarantine for passengers, and fifteen days for goods liable to contagion.
