**LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1858.****NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF ACT BY LONG SUTTON, LINCOLNSHIRE.**

WHEREAS the Local Government Act, 1858, was on the 12th day of January, 1860, duly adopted within "The Long Sutton District," comprising all that part of the parish of Sutton St. Mary, in the county of Lincoln, lying west of the road by the Hospital Marshes, and not included in that portion of the said parish lying east of the said road, which had previously adopted the Local Government Act, 1858, and is styled "The Sutton Bridge District;" and whereas notice of such adoption by the Long Sutton District has been duly given, in writing, to me, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, as required by such Act; and whereas it has now been duly certified to me that a copy of such notice has been advertized for three successive weeks in the Lincolnshire Chronicle and General Advertiser, that being one of the local newspapers published and circulated in the aforesaid district of Long Sutton, and that copies of such notice have also been affixed to the principal doors of each church and chapel in such district, to which notices are usually affixed, and the period of twenty-one days fixed by the said Act for appeal against the resolution for the adoption of the said Act, by such district, has now expired, and no such appeal has been made:

Now, therefore, I, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, do hereby give notice, that the Local Government Act, 1858, has been adopted within the said district of Long Sutton, as hereinbefore described, and that, in accordance with the provisions thereof, the said Act will, at the expiration of two months from the date of the passing of the aforesaid resolution, have the force of law within such district of Long Sutton.

**LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1858.****TRANMERE, CHESHIRE.**

WHEREAS a petition, under the 17th section of the Local Government Act, 1858, has been duly presented to me, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, signed by owners and ratepayers of the township of Tranmere, in the county of Chester, in respect of not less than one-twentieth of the rateable property in such

township, praying that the said township might be excluded from the operation of the aforesaid Act, notwithstanding the vote for the adoption of such Act within such township, passed on the 7th day of October, 1859; and whereas inquiry has been directed into the circumstances of the case set forth in such petition, and such inquiry has been duly made, and the result thereof reported to me, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State:

Now, therefore, I do issue the following order, and do determine—

That the petition aforesaid be dismissed, and that the Local Government Act, 1858, shall, from and after the date hereof, have the force of law within the said township.

NOTICE is hereby given to the Officers, Seamen, and Marines, and to all persons interested therein, that the distribution of proceeds received and tonnage bounty awarded for the Governor Paris, captured on the 2nd July, 1858, by Her Majesty's ship Heron, will commence on Thursday the 23rd February, 1860, in the Prize Branch of the Department of the "Accountant-General of the Navy, Admiralty, Somerset-House."

Agents and other persons holding powers of attorney, prize orders, assignments, or other instruments, by virtue of which they may be legally entitled to claim the share of any captor, serving in the above-named ship, are requested to present the same at this office.
