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Naples, March 21.

THis week parted from hence *Don Carlo Caraffa, Don Nicolo Caraccioli, Don Carlo de Sanzo*, and several other Persons of Quality for *Hungary*, to serve as Volontiers in the Emperor's Army. It's believed the supernumerary Officers of the several Tribunals in this Kingdom, of which there is a great number, will be reformed according to what has been already done in *Spain*; Those that have bought their Places, or had them for a Recompence of their Services, will be provided for upon the first Vacancies, and in the mean time are to receive the Interest of the Money they paid, or part of the Salary of the said Offices.

Genoua, April 1. The Marquis de los Balbaces arrived here this Week from *Milan*, but has not been complimented on the part of the Republick, for that he desires to be *incognito*. The Corsairs of *Barbary* having some days ago taken on these Coasts a Tartane belonging to *Final*, the Senate have ordered two Gallies to go out in search of them.

Leghorne, April 2. The 30th of the last month two of the great Dukes Gallies sailed out of this Port, to clear these Coasts of the Corsairs of *Barbary*, who have within these few days appeared near *Caprana*. The great Duke has given Orders for the hiring two Foreign Vessels to carry Provisions and Ammunition for the Squadron he sends to the assistance of the *Venetians*. By two Vessels arrived from *Alexandria*, we have advice that the *Turkish* Officers continued their Levies in those Parts, according to the repeated Orders they had received from the Port; but that notwithstanding all their endeavors, the number of those they had both by threats and promises got into the Service was very inconsiderable, and these too for the most part were such as seemed hardly capable of bearing Arms.

Venice, April 8. We have advice by a Vessel arrived from *Dalmatia*, that 10000 *Turks* were on their march with six pieces of Cannon to attack *Sign*; And that the Proveditor General *Cornaro* was drawing a Body of Men together for the relief of that place, in which there was a Garison of 600 men. The great Convoy designed for the *Mores*, will sail in two or three days. The Master of a Vessel which came lately from *Zant*, reports that the Troops of *Hanouer* were arrived there from *Napoli di Romania*, where they had their Winter-quarters to join with those that are expected from hence.

Venice April 12. We have an account from *Napoli di Romania*, by Letters of the 17th of the last Month, that all the Ships, Gallies, Galeasses, and other Vessels that are to attend the Fleet, had Orders to repair to the General Rendezvous, which is appointed to be about the beginning of the next

Month; That the new Fortifications on the Hill *Palamida* were brought to that perfection, as not to fear any insult from the Enemy. And that Signior *Venier*, Captain Extraordinary of the Ships, continues to cruize with 5 men of War in the *Archipelago*, and to raise Contributions of the Islands. Part of the new raised Troops, which are to reinforce the *Lunenburg* Regiments, now in the Service of this State, are already arrived at the *Lido*; and the rest are very suddenly expected there, in order to their being transported to the *Mrea*. The Prince of *Bunsirizke*, and the Sieur d' *Avila* whom the Senate have received into their Service in the quality of Lieutenant-General of their Forces are likewise expected here towards the end of this Month. We have Letters from *Constantinople* of the 20th of the last Month, which give an account; that the Grand Visier had sent several Expresses from *Belgrade*, to press for such supplies of Men and Money, as might enable him to put the *Ottoman* Forces in a condition to oppose the farther progress of the Christian Arms in *Hungary*; but that notwithstanding all his Instances, there had been sent him since the beginning of the Winter but 500 Purfes, and the *Caimacan* was endeavouring to send him 500 more; both which Sums do not amount to 150 thousand pounds Sterling.

Madrid, April 10. The Commissioners appointed for the Affairs of the *Milaneze*, have resolved to reform part of the Troops now in the Service of that State. The Regiments that will be broken are two of *Spanish*, and one of *German* Foot; one of Horse, and one of Dragoons, besides several independent Companies. The Prince de *Cariati* is declared Viceroy of *Arragon*, and made Grandee of *Spain*. *Don Emanuel Colorna* parted from hence this week for *Holland*, where he is to reside in the quality of Envoy Extraordinary from this Crown. *Dom Vespasiano Gonzaga*, General of the Ocean, has desired Leave to come to Court, and to resign that Command, which, it's believed, will be joined with that of General of the Fleet, now possessed by the Count d' *Aquilar*.

Vienna, April 13. The Emperor has made six new Counsellors of State, to wit, the Prince de *Lichtensteyn*, the Count de *Staremberg* Governor of this City, the Count de *Tbun*, the Count de *Herbersteyn*, the Count *Vratissau* President of the Chamber of *Bobemia*, and the Count *Lafanskje*. Prince *Clement*, Brother of the Elector of *Bavaria*, Bishop of *Frisingen* and *Ratisbonne*, has, by his Envoy, sent hither for that purpose, received of the Emperor the Investiture of those Principalities. The next week the Conferences will be renewed with the *Moscovite* Ambassadors, which have been intermitted, because of their *Easter*. The last Letters these Ambassadors received from *Moscow*, gave, as they say, an account that the Forces of the Czars were actually on their march towards the *Crim Tartary*, and that several

several experienced Officers had been sent to command the *Cossacks* that are to act in a separate Body against the *Turks* and *Tartars*. We have advice from the *Ottoman* Territories, that the Grand Signior is expected at *Belgrade* towards the end of this month; That in the mean time great Provision is made there and at *Essecke* of Forage and Provisions for the Subsistence of the *Ottoman* Army; And that the *Turks*, to oppose the designs of the *Imperialists*, are building several Palanques, or little Forts on both sides the *Danube* and the *Drave*. The Bishop of *Primissia*, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of *Poland*, has had several Conferences with the Imperial Ministers, and intends to part from hence very suddenly for *Rome* and *Venice*, to finish at those Courts the Commission he is charged with. The States of *Franconia* and *Swabia* have assured the Emperor, that their Troops which are to serve in *Hungary* the next Campaign, shall be ready to embark at *Ulm* about the middle of the next month. The *Turkish* Aga who arrived the 21 of the last month at *Debrezen*, continues still there, expecting Passports, that he may repair to *Esperies*, to deliver his Message to General *Caraffa*.

Vienna, April 13. On Thursday last the Conference was reassumed with the *Moscovite* Ambassadors, and we are told that the matters, which are the Subject of it, are so far adjusted, that the Ambassadors begin to talk already of demanding their Audience of Leave. The Duke of *Lorraine* has, since his Arrival here, had divers Consultations with the general Officers and principal Ministers, who are of the Council of War, about the Operations of the Campaign; And, it's said, they have resolved that the General Rendezvous shall be held the 15th of the next month between *Gran* and *Buda*. The Elector of *Bavaria* is expected here towards the end of this month; He will have a Body of 12000 men of his own Troops. We have an account from *Esperies*, that a farther Discovery had been made of divers Persons who were concerned in the Conspiracy, that was lately discovered in *Upper Hungary*; and that six of the chief of these had been brought Prisoners to *Esperies*. That General *Caraffa* had sent Detachements towards the *Thyssa*, to observe the Enemies motions on that side. That the *Turks* of *Agria* continue to desert in great numbers, by which, as well as the want of Provisions, that Garrison is reduced to a condition, that without a speedy relief, or which they have little expectation, will force them to surrender the place to the *Imperialists*. An Express arrived here some days ago from *Transilvania*, with advice that Prince *Abafri*, and the States of that Countrey, have finally resolved to put themselves under the Emperor's Protection, upon condition the Emperor will defend them against all their Enemies, and will free them from the yearly Tribute they are now obliged to pay to the *Port*; And that they had sent to *Esperies* 100000 Florins, and 100000 Measures of Corn for the use of the Imperial Troops, in pursuance of their late Agreement with General *Caraffa*.

Brussels, April 25. They write from *Liege* of the 22d Instant, that the Cardinal of *Furtemberg* was gone from thence to the Court of the Elector of *Cologne*. The Letters from *Vienna* of the 13th of this month, tell us of the great Preparations that are making for the opening of the Campaign, and that vast quantities of Provisions and Ammunition were daily sent down the *Danube*.

Brussels, April 29. Our Governour General has resolved, with the advice of the Council of War, that all the Cavalry and Dragoons in the Service of these Countries, except some Troops which are to remain in the Frontier Garrisons, shall encamp this Summer for six Weeks or two Months in the Pro-

vince of *Gelderland*, under the Command of the Count de *Salazar* Lieutenant General of the Horse, and the Count de *Valsbigne* Lieutenant General of Dragoons. The Letters from *Vienna* of the 17th Instant give an account, that the *Bavarian* Troops are on their march towards *Hungary*, and that the Elector and Electores of *Bavaria* are expected at *Vienna* about the end of this month; And that an Express was arrived at *Vienna*, with the News that the Prince and States of *Transilvania* had resolved to put themselves under the Emperor's protection.

Paris, April 30. The King's Journey to *Luxemburg* is put off till the 10th of the next month. Monsieur de *Louvois* parted from hence this morning for *Alsace*, intending to visit *Strasbourg*, *Hunningen*, *Brisa*, *Friburg*, and the other Frontier places on that side, and to return and meet the Court at *Luxemburg*. The Letters from *Madrid* give an account, that the King of *Spain* was indisposed with an Ague, of which he had two or three Fits.

Whitehall, April 21. The 16th Instant died his Grace *George Duke of Buckingham*, Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, at his House in *Yorkshire*.

Whitehall, April 22. His Majesty has thought fit to remove the Lord Chief Justice *Herbert* to the *Common-Pleas*, and the Lord Chief Justice *Wright* to the *King's Bench*. And Sir *Francis Withens*, one of the Justices of the *King's Bench*, has his *Quittus*.
