

# The London Gazette.

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Venice, April 19.

**T**Here are now at the *Lido* 1000 Foot and 900 Dragoons, which were Mustered there the 16th Instant. They will embark in few days on the Vessels that are to transport them to the *Morea*, to make room for the Cavalry that are expected from the *Terra Firma*, and the Troops of *Hanover* and *Hesse*, which are likewise expected in few days. Colonel *Mocenigo* has with the Emperor's leave, made an agreement with the Senate to raise a Regiment of Horse in *Croatia*, for the Service of the Republick; And another Person of quality has undertaken to raise a Regiment of Foot in *Catalonia* for the same Service. The Senate have resolved to send 1000 Foot to *Dalmatia*; We have an account from that Province, that the *Turks*, to the number of 12000 Men, had advanced with 6 pieces of Cannon and 2 Mortars to *Sign*, while another Body of 8000 moved towards *Zera*, with a design to make an incursion into that Province; and that the *Proveditore-General Cornaro*, and Signior *Zen*, General of the Horse were thereupon drawing all the Troops they could together for the relief of *Sign*; the *Garison* of which place had in a Sally they made upon the Enemy, killed 120 of them, taken several prisoners, with 7 Colours, and nailed up their Cannon. The Letters from *Constantinople* of the 20th of *February*, of which you had some account in our last, tell us farther, That the *Caimacan*, to raise Money for the War, had sent to all the rich *Musselmen*, to require them to assist the Grand Signior according to their several circumstances, fixing at the same time the sums that were expected of them, by which means 6000 Purfes had been already raised at *Constantinople*; and it's not doubted but the same method will be taken through the whole *Ottoman* Empire: That the *Caimacan* made likewise his utmost efforts to raise Men, And that a *Bucangee* having desired to be excused from being sent to the War, in regard his Education had not qualified him for that sort of Service, had after receiving 500 Drubs, been obliged to comply with the Grand Signior's Command; And that another who pretended to such extreme Poverty, that he was not able to provide any one part of his necessaries for the War, had been sent to the Gallies. And that Officers had been dispatched into all the Provinces, to hasten the Levies which the *Bassa's* have Orders to make within their re-

spective Governments. These Letters add, That the *Caimacan* had sent for the Greek Patriarch of *Constantinople*, and had obliged him to write to the Patriarch of *Moscovy*, to endeavour by his means, to divert the *Czars* from their resolution of entering into the War against the Grand Signior; for that the *Turks*, upon the first act of Hostility, committed by the *Moscovite* Forces, would revenge it upon all the *Greeks* within the *Ottoman* Dominions. And that 5 Men of War were sitting at *Constantinople* to carry a reinforcement to *Napoli di Malvasia*, the strongest place, which the *Turks* remain Masters of in the *Morea*.

*Dantzicke*, April 15. The Letters from *Lemberg* of the 2d Instant tell us, they had received advice by the way of *Valadisa*, that the Cham of *Tartary* Lad, at the instance of the Grand Signior, notwithstanding the great need he has of his Troops to defend his own Countries against the *Moscovites*, resolved to send a considerable Body of *Tartars*, under the Command of *Sultan Galga*, to joyn the *Ottoman* Forces in *Hungary* the next Campaign; That *Sultan Nuradin* is to act with 20000 *Tartars* against the *Phles*, to give them a diversion by their incursions into the Frontier Provinces of that Kingdom; while the Cham with the rest of his Forces makes head against the *Moscovites*.

*Vienna*, April 20. The Emperor has named the Count *de Conengsec* Vice-Chancellor of the Empire, and the Count *de Straetman* Great Chanceller of the Court, to confer with the Bishop of *Primsilia*, who, after he has dispatched his Affairs at this Court, will go to *Rome* and *Venice*, where he will appear with the Character of Ambassador Extraordinary from the Crown of *Poland*. The *Moscovite* Ambassadors having finished their Negotiation with the Imperial Ministers are preparing for their departure; the two first have Orders to return to *Moscow*, and the other two to go to *Venice*, to confirm the League with the Republick. We have an account from *Buda*, that several Companies of Foot were arrived there to reinforce that *Garison*. And that the Sentence pronounced against the Lieutenant *Finckenstein* was executed the 9th of this Month. He had suffered the Torture, without declaring any thing more, than what he had before confessed. And that the Peasant that carried the Letters between him and the *Bassa* of *Alba Regalis*, was at the same time Impaled. Several Parties which had been sent from *Buda* were come back, without any news of the Enemy, who keep themselves very quiet within their *Garisons*.

*Cologne*, April 27. The Cardinal of *Furstemberg* has had an Enterview with the Elector of *Cologne*

at *Bonne*, and is expected here to Morrow. The *Comde de Villar Mayr*, Ambassador Extraordinary from the *King of Portugal* to the Elector Palatine, arrived the last week at *Manheim*. The Letters from *Vienna* give an account that 2000 new raised Men were arrived at *Presburg*, being Recruits for the Imperial Regiments quartered in *Hungary*. That the Elector of *Bavaria* had sent to acquaint the Emperor, that his Forces would begin their march towards *Hungary*, before the end of this Month; and that he himself would follow them in few days. That daily Consultations were in the mean time held in the Emperor's Presence to concert the designs of the Campaign; and that the Duke of *Lorraine* had given out Orders for the Troops to be all at the General Rendezvous on the Fifteenth of the next Month between *Gran* and *Buda*. That the *Moscovite* Ambassadors had adjusted all the points of their Commission, except that about the Title of Majesty, which the Emperor continues to make some difficulty to give the *Czars*; That the Prince *Saxemei* the Chief of the Embassy, and the Chancellor of *Moscow* had Orders to return home. but the other two Ambassadors were to go on to *Venice*, to take the same measures with the Republick, as they have already done with the Imperial Court, and that of *Poland*. That the Lieutenant who would have betrayed *Buda*, was executed there the 9th Instant. He was some days before put to the Torture, but would not confess that any Persons had been concerned with him in the Correspondence he had with the *Bassa of Acha Regain*. Some Letters likewise say, that the Prince and States of *Transylvania* had finally resolved to put themselves under the Emperor's Protection; which needs a confirmation.

*Hamburg, April 29.* It is confirmed by the last advices from *Poland*; that the *Turks* had put a Convoy of Provisions into *Camimic*. The same Letters give an account of a Rencontre between the *Moscovites* and the *Tartars*, in which the latter had, at first the advantage, having killed 200 of the *Moscovites*, and taken 80 Waggons; but these rallying, renewed the Fight, and entirely defeated the *Tartars*. The Letters from *Moscow* of the 17th of the last Month tell us, that *Kneff Wasil Wasslewee Galitzen*, Great Chancellor and General of the Forces of that Kingdom, parted from thence the 27th of *February*, accompanied with a great number of Officers and Volontiers, to put himself at the head of the Army, which was appointed to Rendezvous on the Frontiers of *Tartary*.

*Brussels, May 2.* Our Governour-General went yesterday to *Tervuren* to meet Prince *Waldeck*, Mareschal de Camp General of the Forces in the Service of the States-General, who by reason of some Domestic Affairs, past that way in his return to *Germany*; His Excellency was accompanied with all the General Officers, and having Dined there, returned hither in the Evening. The Inter-nuncio at this Court has given notice to all the foreign Ministers here, that his Holiness has named him to be his Nuncio at *Cologne*. The Letters from *Vienna* of the 20th inst, tell us that the *Bavarian* Foot were to embark on the *Danube* the 24th of the last Month, to pass down that River to *Presburg*. That the Imperial Troops that were quartered in *Bohe-*

*mia, Silesia, and Moravia* had likewise Orders to begin their march to the general Rendezvous, which continued fixt for the 15th of the next Month between *Gran* and *Buda*. We are told that the Electors of *Brandenburg* and *Saxony* do not send any Troops to *Hungary* this Campaigne.

*Hague, May 2.* The Prince of *Orange* returned hither yesterday from *Loos*; and her Royal Highness this Evening. The Princess of *Nassau* parted from hence this Morning for *Leuwaterden*. The Count *d'Avaux* Ambassador of *France*, is going to meet the *French* Court at *Luxemburg*.

*Whitehal, April 26.* His Majesty having out of His Royal Favour to the Right Honourable the Earl of *Sunderland*, Lord President of the Council, and His Majesties Principal Secretary of State, been pleased to give him the Garter, upon the death of the late Duke of *Buckingham*; a Chapter was held this day, where his Lordship was with the usual Ceremony, Elected a Knight Companion of that most Noble Order.
