Here are now at the Lido 1000 Foot and 900 Dragoons, which were Mustered there the 16th Inftant. They will embark in few days on the Veffels that are to transport them to the Morea, to make room for the Cavalry that are expected from the Terra Firma, and the Troops of Hanouer and Heffe, which are likewife expected in few days. Colonel Mocenigo has with the Emperor's leave, made an agreement with the Senate to raife a Regiment of Horfe in Croatia, for the Service of the Republick; And another Perfon of qua-lity has undertaken to raife a Regiment of Foot in Catalonia for the fame Service. The Senate have refolved to fend 1000 Foot to Dalmatia; We have an account from that Province, that the Turks, to the number of 1 2000 Men, had advanced with 6 pieces of Cannon and 2 Mortars to Sign, while another Body of 8000 moved towards Zara, with a defign to make an incursion into that Province; and that the Proveditore-General Cornaro, and Signior Zen, General of the Horfe were thereupon drawing all the Troops they could together for the relief of Sign; the Garifon of which place had in a Sally they made upon the Enemy, killed 120 of them, taken feveral prifoners, with 7 Colours, and nailed up their Cannon. The Letters from Conftantinople of the 20th of February, of which you had fome ac-count in our laft, tell us farther, That the Caimacan, to raife Money for the War, had fent to all the rich Muffelmen, to require them to affift the Grand Signior according to their feveral circumstances, fixing at the same time the sums that were expected of them, by which means 6000 Purfes had been already raifed at Confhantr-nople; and it's not doubted but the fame method will be taken through the whole Ottoman Empire : That the Caimacan made likewife his utmost efforts to raile Men, And that a Butangee having defired to be exculed from being fent to the War, in regard his Education had not qualified him for that fort of Service, had after receiving 500 Drubs, been ob-liged to comply with the Grand Signior's Command; And that another who pretended to fuch extreme Poverty, that he was not able to provide any one part of his necessaries for the War, had been fent to the Gallies. And that Officers had been difpatch. ed into all the Provinces, to halten the Levies which

These Letters add, That the Caimacan had fent for the Greek Patriarch of Csnstantinople, and had obliged him to write to the Patriarch of Moscowy, to endeavour by his means, to divert the Czars from, their resolution of entring into the War against the Grand Signiors for that the Turks, upon the first act of Hoitility, committed by the Moscowite Forces, would revenge it upon all the Greeks within the Ottoman Dominions. And that 5 Men of War were fitting at Constantinople to carry & reinforcement to Napoli di Malvassia, the ftrongest place which the Turks remain Masters of in the Morea.

Danzicke, April 15. The Letters from Lemberg of the 2d Inftant tell us, they had received advice by the way of Valadbia, that the Cham of Tartary Lad, at the inftance of the Grand Signior, notwithftanding the great need he has of his Troops to defend his own Countries againft the Molecoutes, refolved to fend a confiderable Body of Tattars, under the Command of Sultan Galga, to joyn the Ottoman Forces in Hungary the next Campagne; That Sultan Nuradin is to aCt with 2000 Tattars againft the Poles, to give them a diversion by their incurfions into the Frontier Provinces of that Kingdom; while the Cham with the reft of his Forces makes head againft the Molecoutes.

Vienna, April 20. The Emperor has named the Count de Coneng fec Vice-Chancellor of the Empire, and the Count de Straetman Great Chancellor of the Court, to confer with the Bishop of Primilia, who, after he has dispached his Affairs at this Court, will go to Rome and Venice, where he will appear with the Character of Ambassador Extraordinary from the Crown of Poland. The Mofcovite Ambaffadors having finished their Negotiation with the Imperial Minifters are preparing for their departure; the two first have Orders to return to Mo/com, and the 0ther two to go to Venice, to confirm the League with the Republick. That daily Confultations were in the mean time held in the Emperor's Prefere. to concert the defigns of the Campagne ; and that the Duke of I errain had given out Orders for the Troops to be all at the General Rendezvous on the Fifteenth of the next Month between Gran and That the Moscovite Ambaffadors had Buda. adjuffed all the points of their Committion, except that about the Title of Majelly, which the Emperor continues to make fome difficulty to give the Czars; That the Prince Szremei the Chief of the Embally, and the Chancellor of Mefcito had Orders to return home. but the other two Ambalfadors were to go on to Venice, to take the fame measures with the Republick, as they have already done with the Imperial Court, and that of *Polavid*.
