THIS day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by Her Majesty, for declaring Her Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read;* and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act to apply the sum of eight hundred and fifty thousand pounds out of the consolidated fund to the service of the year ending the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and sixty.

An Act for punishing mutiny and desertion, and for the better payment of the army and their quarters.

An Act for the regulation of Her Majesty's Royal Marine Forces while on shore.

An Act to amend the law relating to endowed schools.

An Act to prevent the members of benefit societies from forfeiting their interest therein by being enrolled in yeomanry or volunteer corps.

An Act to repeal, alter, amend, and extend some of the powers and provisions of "The Silverdale and Newcastle Railway Act, 1859," to authorize the stopping-up, altering and constructing of certain roads and for other purposes."

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade and Plantations have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Minister at Naples, enclosing a translation of a Royal Neapolitan Decree, imposing the following duties upon the undermentioned articles when exported by sea from the Province of Calabria Ulteriore :—

Silk, 1 grani (one farthing and three-fifths) per lb.
Lemon Juice, 1 ducat (8s. 3½d.) per cask.

Green Fruit, ¼ grani (four-fifths of a farthing) per case.

Green Wood, and Wood used in the manufacture of casks, ½ grani (four-fifths of a farthing) per load.

Oil exported to Foreign Countries, 30 grani (1s.) per cask, including the 20 grani (8d.) levied at the Ports of Gioja and Sidermo.
