THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade and Plantations have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a translation of a Portuguese Royal Decree permitting until the 30th June next, the free importation of wheat and rye, the consumption duty charged upon such grain to be the same as that paid upon native produce.

The same decree further provides that such produce will be admitted upon the same footing, even after the expiration of the above-named period, provided that it comes direct from the port of departure with a reasonable anticipation of arriving at a Portuguese port within the allotted period.
