LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1858.

NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF ACT BY BEWDLEY, WORCESTERSHIRE.

WHEREAS, the Local Government Act, 1858,
was duly adopted on the 2nd day of May, 1860,
by the borough of Bewdley, in the county of
Worcester, and notice of such adoption has been
duly given, in writing, to me, as one of Her
Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, as re-
quired by such Act. And whereas it has now
been duly certified to me that a copy of such
notice has been advertised for three successive
weeks in the Worcestershire Chronicle, that being
one of the local newspapers published and circulated
in the aforesaid borough, and that copies of such
notice have also been affixed to the principal doors
of each church and chapel in such borough to which
notices are usually affixed; and the period of
twenty-one days, fixed by the said Act for appeal
against the resolution for the adoption of the said
Act by such borough, has now expired, and no
such appeal has been made:

Now, therefore, I, as one of Her Majesty's
Principal Secretaries of State, do hereby give
notice, that the Local Government Act, 1858, has
been adopted within the borough of Bewdley, in
the county of Worcester, and that, in accordance
with the provisions thereof, the said Act will, at
the expiration of two months from the date of the
passing of the aforesaid Resolution, have the force
of law within such borough.
