THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade and Plantations have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Minister at Caracas, reporting that the duties upon the undermentioned articles, exported from the ports of Venezuela, have been increased as follows:

Coffee from  $31\frac{1}{4}$  to 75 cents per 100 lbs. Cocoa from 50 cents to 2 dollars per 110 lbs. Hides from  $12\frac{1}{2}$  to 75 cents each.
