Milan, April 22. Our Governor has received Orders from the Court at Madrid, to reform part of the Troops now in the Service of this State, which he is going to put in execution. The Command of Maistre de Camp General of the Horse, at prefont poffessed by the Marquis de Castel Rodrigo; And that of General of the Arms, which was lately given to the Duke del Sefto Son of the Marquis de los Balbaces, will be both suppressed. The Count de Eucnfalida was the laft week at Novare, and fome other places, to vifit the Fortifications, and take a Review of the Troops in Gariton there.

Venice, April 26. The last Advices from Dal-matia, said that the Turks continued the Siege of Sign, but that they had been repulsed in two Attacks they made upon a Hornwork with the lofs of 600 Men; And that the Proveditor Cernaro was marching with 12000 Men to the Relief of the Be-fieged. We have had no Letters from the Levant this week; but understand by a Vessel arrived from Corfon, that the General Rendezvous of the Vene-tian Fleet will be about the middle of the next month. - The 22d Inftant a Fire happed in the place of St. Antonio di Castello where they made Powder, which blew up part of that Building, and buried all the Workmen, except two or three under its Ruines. The next day another Fire hapned in this City, which burnt down two Houfes. The Cavalry, now at the Lido, will embark the next week or feveral great Marfilianes that have been fent for from Istria.

Madrid, April 24. The King and Queen went on Sunday last to the Buen Rettro, with intention to ftay there greatest part of the Summer; and this morn4

morning his Catholick Majefty parted for Aranjuez, from whence he will return on Wedneiday. On Monday last the Count de Melgar, late Governor of Milan, who had been fome time under Confine-ment, was admitted to Rifs the King's hand. The Cardinal d'Aguirre being returned hither from fo-ledo, and having taken his Leave of all the Grandees, parted from hence on Friday last on his Journey to Rome, being accompanied feveral Miles out of Town by the Marquis de Castek Rodrigo, Dom Emanuel de Lyra, and the Conde de Banos. The Sur-Intendant and the Veedor General of the Low-Countries will begin their Journey thither towards the end of the next week. We have an account from Alicant, That the Marquis de Cogolludo, the King's Ambaffador to the Pope, and the Duke de Monteleon, were embarked on two English Ships, on which they intended to pais to Genoua. They write from Cadiz, That the Moors have befieged the Fortreis of Penon on the Coaft of Africa; And that the Vice-Admiral Papachino had, upon the News of it, fent the two Men of War that were defigned to carry the Duke d'Uzeda, Viceroy of Sielly, to his Government, with Men and Ammunition for the Relief of that place; into which 60 Men had got from Gibraitar.

Vienna, April 27. The Publick Prayers which the Emperor has ordered to be made, for the imploring the Divine Benediction upon the Christian Arms, were begun on Friday laft in the Cathedral Church of St. Stephen, whither their Imperial Majefties went in Solemn Procession with all the Nobility, Minifters, and Officers of the Court; And these Devotions will be continued during the Ostave, in all the Parishes of this City. The 25th Instant was held the laft Conference with the Mojcovite Ambaffadors, who are now preparing for their departure, Orders have been fent to all the Troops to be at the generai Rendezvous near Gran, the 15th of the next Month; And in the mean time vaft quantities of Provisions and Ammunition are fent down the Danube. The Bavarian Cavalry are expected here the 8th or 10th of the next Month in their march to Hungary. They write from Buda that great many Boats arrived there daily with Materials for the repairing the Fortifications and the Houfes of that place, ruined during the Siege. The Imperial Court goes the 5th of the next Month to Laxemburgh.

Cologne, May 6. The Cardinal of Funftemberg returned on Friday laft to Bonne, from whence he intends to go in three or four days with Count Ferdinand his Nephew, to meet the French Court at Luxemburgh. They write from Eyfenacke, That on the 28th of the last month 14 Companies of Foot, railed by the Duke of Hanouer for the Service of the Republick of Venice, paffed by that place, ta-king their march towards Markstool. The Letters from Vienna of the 28th paft tell us, they had received advice from Croatia, that the Turks had been forced to abandon the Siege of Sign, after having loft a great many Men in the Attacks they had made upon that place; of which we must expect the Confirmation by the next Italian Letters.

Hamburgh, May to. We are told from Copenbigen, That the Emperor has written to the King o. Denmark, to offer his Mediation about the Ato. Demuter, to offer his internation about the Af-firs of the Duke of Holftein; and that his Majeity h d accepted of it. They write from Mofcowy, that their Forces were marching to the General Ren-dezvous, and that in the mean time the Coffacks, commandad by the Sieur Sumalowitz, had Orders to guard the paffages of the Nieper. The Letters from Lemberg in Poland of the 12th of the laft month tell us, That Sultan Nuradin was come with a great Body of Tartars into the Neighborhood of

Caminiec; And that the Coffacks, who were posted thereabouts under the Command of the Sieur Mebila, to block up that Garifon, had been thereupon forced to retire.

Hague, May 13. The States of Friesland have confented to the state of the War for this present year. The States of Holland are ftill affembled, but it's believed they will adjourn to morrow or next day, till after the Holy-days. The 10th Inftant being her R. H. the Princels of Oranges Birthday, the Marquis d'Albeville, Envoy Extraordinary from His Majelly of Great Britain, made a very fplendid Entertainment, at which were prefent a great many Perfons of Quality of both Sexes.

Paris, May 13. The King lay the 11th Inftant at la Ferre jous Jouaire, yefferday at Montmurel, and this day at Vertus, to morrow his Majefty will be at Chalons, the 16th at St. Menebour, the 17th at Verdun, the 18th at Estain, the 19th at Longuy, and the 20th at Luxemburgh, where his Majefty intends to ftay three days. The Marquis de Boufflers is gone to command the Camp on the Soane; And Monfieur de St. Ruth is to command the Troops that are to encamp on the fide of Bayonne. The Marquis de Charoft has taken the ufual Oath of Lieutenant General of Picardie.
