Multa, April 30.

H E Squadron of this Order, defigned for the Allistance, of the Venetians, parted from hence the 24th Inftant for the Levant; It was compofed of 8 Gallies, Commanded by the Count de Herberstein, Great Prior of Hun-gary; and there were embarqued on them 1200 Land Soldiers, and 160 Knights of Multa, Commanded by the Chevalier de Meschatin as General, by the Chevalier de Marevil as Lieutenant-General, and the Chevalier Lusignan as Major. Thefe Gallies were attended by a great Ship fitted for a Man of War, and two others laden with Arms, Ammunition and Provisions, fufficient for the whole Campagne.

Genoua, April 15. The 10th Inftant two Gallies failed from hence for Corfica, to change the Garifons in that Ifland, after which, they are to cruife on these Coasts to chase from thence the Corfairs of Barbary, who have of late taken feveral Prizes. A Galley of the Squadion of Siety is arrived here

Milan, May 13. The 10th Inftant the Count de Fuenfalida, our Governor, took a general Review at Pavia of the Forces in the Service of this State, and at the fame time in purfuance of the Orders he had received from the Court at Madrid The Regiments of German Horfe commanded by Count Scotti, and the Chevalier Visconti, the Neapolitan Regiment of Moles, the Spanifh Regi-ment of Heredia, and that of Barile, and 42 Companies of Foot of divers Nations, were reformed. And all the Troops of Horfe that remain on Foot,

were reduced each to 40 Men. Venice, May 23. The Bilhop of Primiflia arrived here the last week with the Character of Ambaffador Extraordinary from the Crown of Poland; It's believed he will make his publick Entry the next week, after which; he will remove from the Convent of St. Nicolas & Frari, where he is at prefent Incognito, to the Palace Foscari, which is prepared for him by Order of the Senate. The Prince of Brunswick will part from hence in three or four days with a great Convoy for the Morene We have an Account by Letters of the 25th of the

last month from Napoli di Romanza, that Captain-General Morofini failed from thence fome days before with the Gallies and Galleaffes towards Navarin, to join the Auxiliary Gallies and the Convoys fent from hence. And that Signior Venier And that Signior Venier Captain-Extraordinary of the Ships, was returned to Napoli di Romania, with the Contributions he had railed of the Islands in the Archipelago. They write from Daimatia, that the Turks in their late hafty and difordily retreat from before Sign, had thrown fome of their heaviest Cannon into the River Cettina; and that these Infidels having afterwards detached 2000 men to plunder the Country about Prinorgia, the Inhabitants, with the affi-france of fome Troops quartered on that fide, defended themselves so well, that they obliged the Ene-

The laft Letters from Vienna, gave an Account, That the Imperial Forces were marching to the general Rendezvous, to the number of 52000 Men, without reckoning the Himgarians, and the two new Companies, of 150 Men each, that are added to every Regiment, which will not be compleat till the end of the next month.
