Malta, April 30.

H E Squadron of this Order, defigned for the Alfiltance, of the Venetians, parted from hence the 24th Inftant for the Levant; It was compofed of 8 Gallies, Commanded by the Count de Herberftein, Great Prior of Hungary; and there were embarqued on them 1200 Land Soldiers, and 160 Knights of Malta, Commanded by the Chevalier de Melchatin as General, by the Chevalier de Marevil as Lieutenant-General, and the Chévalier de Marevil as Lieutenant-General, lies were attended by a great Ship fitted for a Man of War, and two others laden with Arms, Ammunition and Provisions, fufficient for the whole Campagne.

Milan, May 13. The Bilhop of Primiflia arrived here the laft week with the Character of Ambaffador Extraordinary from the Crown of Poland; It's believed he will make his publick Entry the next week, after which, he will remove from the Convent of SC. Nicolas A Frari, where he is at prefent Incognito, to the Palace Fofcari, which is prepared for him by Order of the Senate. The Prince of Brunfinick will part from hence in three or four days with a great Convoy for the Moreau We have an Account by Letters of the 25th of the laft month from Napoli di Romania, that Captain-General Morofini failed from thence fome days before with the Gallies and Galleaffes towards Navarin, to join the Auxiliary Gallies and the Convoys fent from hence. And that Signior Venner Captain-Extraordinary of the Ships, was returned to Napoli di Romania, with the Contributions he had railed of the Illands in the Archipelago. They write from Dalmatia, that the Turks in their late hafty and difordily retreat from before Sign, had thrown fome of their heavieft Cannon into the Riyer Cettina; and that these Infidels having afterwards detached 2000 men to plunder the Country about Prinorgia, the Inhabitants, with the affifrance of fome Troops quartered on that fide, defended themielves fo well, that they obliged the Enemy to retire with the loss of above 1000 of their Men.

The Tartars, who made the late Incurtions into the Province of Padolia, are retired with a great deal of Booty, the Polific Troops and the Colfackes which were fent after them coming too late. The Mofcovites are marching towards the Crimee with very numerous Troops; But there is a Report, that the Zuporovian Colfacks do give the Tartars all the Aiffance they can.

Vienna, May 25. The Duke of Lorrain having taken his Leave yefterday of the Emperor at Laxemburgh, parted this Morning for Hungary, intending to go directly to the general Rendezvous of the Imperial Army, which is appointed to be held near Barkan. On Thurfday laft paffed by this City, the Bavarian Dragoons, and yefterday arrived here two Regiments of Horfe in their match to Hurgary. The Auxiliary Troops of Franconia and Suddua, are daily expected.
