

ing together to hinder their design. We have an Account from *Five Churches*, That that place is in a very good Condition, the Fortifications being very well repaired, and the Garrison provided with all things necessary for their defence; And that a Party of *Hussars* of that Garrison, had defeated 200 *Turks* who thought to have intercepted a Convoy that was sent from *Five Churches* to *Cop sinier*. The Princess *Ragotzi* solicites for Leave to send Deputies hither, to treat of Articles for the Surrender of *Mongatz*. The last Letters from *Poland* gave an Account, That the Forces of that Crown were at the general Rendezvous, and that so soon as they had joined with those of *Lithuania*, they would march towards the *Niester* to pass that River.

*Frankfort, May 31.* The Troops which the Circles of *Franconia* and *Suabia* send to the Emperor's Assistance, are on their march towards *Hungary*. Our last Letters from *Munich*, said the Elector of *Bavaria* intended to part from thence in few days for *Vienna*. We are told from *Hydelberg*, That the Ceremonies of the Marriage of the King of *Portugal*, with the Princess *Maria Sophia*, his Electoral Highnesses Daughter, will be performed at *Manheim* the 2d of *July*, with great Magnificence.

*Cologne, June 2.* The last Letters from *Vienna*, gave an Account, That the Imperial Forces were marching to the general Rendezvous, to the number of 52000 Men, without reckoning the *Hungarians*, and the two new Companies, of 150 Men each, that are added to every Regiment, which will not be compleat till the end of the next month. The Elector of *Bavaria* will, it's said, send with a separate Body in *Upper Hungary*, which is to be commanded under him by Prince *Louis* of *Bavaria*. Count *Cavassa*, in quality of Lieutenant General. These Troops assemble at *Zolnock*; And the Army, which will be Commanded by the Emperor *Lorraine*, has it's Rendezvous near *Birken*. The *Turks* have laid a Bridge over the *Danube* at *Peterwaradin*, and to secure it, have built a Fort, in which they have posted 600 Janiziers, and have provided great Magazines at *Semeswaer*. They write from *Transylvania*, that Prince *Abditi* had declared to the States of that Country, that it was their interest, to endeavor to maintain a Neutrality in the present War between the Emperor and the *Turks*.

*Hamburgh, May 30.* The Letters from *Warsaw* of the 16th Instant, tell us the Court of *Poland* continued at *Zolkiew*, where the Council of War assembled daily in the King's Presence, to consult about the Operations of the Campagne. That the Forces of the Crown were in a Body at *Jaslomitz*; And had Orders to march from thence towards *Tarnogel*, to meet the Troops of *Lithuania*, who are 15000 strong. And that the Crown General had received a Letter from the General of the *Moscovite* Forces, giving an Account, That he was arrived at the general Rendezvous on the Frontiers of the *Crim-Tartary*, but that he was desirous to hear that the Army of *Poland* was likewise in the Field before he put his designs in execution.

*Hague, June 3.* The States have resolved to Farm the Customs of these Countries for three years. The Baron *Scutz*, Envoy Extraordinary from the Duke of *Zell*, at the Court of *France*, is arrived here in his return home. Don *Emanuel de Colomna*, who comes to reside here on the part of the Crown

of *Spain*, is now very suddenly expected. The States of *Holland* are adjourned till *Tuesday* next. The Heer *Van Groor*, the Duke of *Ulster*'s Minister is arrived here.

*Windsor, May 30.* On *Saturday* last his Grace the Duke of *Beimock* took his Leave of the King, and began his Journey for *Hungary*, where he intends to pass this Summer in the Imperial Army. And at the same time His Majesty was pleased to Confer the Honour of Knighthood upon *Edward Vaudrey Esq;* who now attends his Grace as he did the last Campaign.

His Majesty having ordered several Regiments of Foot to encamp on *Honslow-Heath*, upon *Tuesday* next, being the 7th of this Instant *June*; As likewise the Horse and Dragoons to encamp in the same place on the 22d following. These are by His Majesty's Command to give Notice, That a free Market will be held at the said Camp, where all Persons will be admitted and encouraged, to bring all sorts of Provisions, and Necessaries for Man and Horse, without paying any thing for their Standings, or on any account whatsoever: And if any Soldier or other shall presume in any wise to molest, injure, or exact Money from such as bring Provisions thither; The Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Forces will take care upon Complaint made unto him, to cause speedy Redress to be given, and the Offender to be severely punished.
