Warfow, May 12. The Letters from Zolkiew of the 6th Instant tell us, the Court would remove in few days for Jawarren; from whence the King intended to go to the general Rendezvous of the Army, and the Queen to the Bath at Hirfberg in Silefia. It's faid that the Forces of the Crown, after their conjunction with those of Lithuania, will advance towards the Forest of Buckevina, to endeavour to draw the Enemy to a Battle. In the mean time there is a report that 40000 Tartars have paffed the Borifthenes, and that a detachement has been fent from this Body, under the Command of Sultan Nuradin, to make new incursions into the Frontier Provinces of this Kingdom ; whereupon, the Po'sh Garifons on the fide of Volhinia, which Province feems to be the most threatned, have not only been reinforced, but Orders have been fent to the Cofficiks Commanded by General Mobila, to have a watchful Eye upon the Enemies These Letters from Zukiew inform us motions. farther, that the Officer who had been fent by the Crown-General to Prince Galitzen General of the Mycavite Forces, was come back, and reported, that he met the faid General at Kiersko, on the other fide of the Borifthenes, and having delivered the Letter he was charged with, was directed to follow him to Achtiska on the Frontiers of the Crimeé, the place of their general Rendezvous; That arriving there, the General took a Review of his Forces in the prefence of the faid Officer, whom he difpached fome days after with an Anfwer to the Letter he had received by him; wherein he gives the Crown-General an account, That the Moscovite Army was composed of Two hundred thousand fighting Men, belides Servants; That the Coffacks made a Body of Icocoo; and that they had with them a Train of 400 pieces of Cannon and Mortars; That he intended to decamp the 3d of this Month, and to enter into the Territorics of the Precopian Tartaks and to fend at the fame time a ftrong detachement to attack Affake, and the other places on the Borifthenes, in which the Turks have Garifons, that thereby a paffage might be opened to the Colfacks to enter into the Black Sea, and to make their incursions as tar as Constantinople; But he concludes his Letter with a Declaration; That he would not put thefe defigns in execution, till he understood that the Army of this Crown was likewife in the Field, and marching into the Enemies Countries.

Vienn 1, May 29. The Imperial Forces are, it's believed, by this time at the General Rendezvous near Borkun. The main Army commanded by the Duke of Lerrain, will be composed of between 40 and 50000 Men; That which is to act in Upper Hungary, under the Orders of the Elector of Bavaria, will be of 2000; And the Body in Croatia is to be of 8000 Men. His Electoral Highness is expected here the beginning of the next Month; and in the mean time his Infantry that had their winter Quarters in Hungary, are marching towards Zolnocie, where the Forces that are to ferve on that fide and appointed to allemble. We have an ac count from Fiv: Churches, that a Party of Houfe and Dragoons of that Garifon, commanded by the Baion d' Or ich, had taken 40 Hoifes and Onen, and 200 Sheer, from under the Walls of S geth, after having defeated 200 Spahis, who fallied out of that place to attack them; being fupported by ! a detachement of Jarafaries, who had posted themfelves very advantageou fly behind the Hedges; The I' rks came on with great fucy, but after feveral Charges found themielves obliged to retreat to the Town, which they d.d in great diforder, having had between 40 and 50 of then Men Killed, and manywounded; of the Imperialifts there were 11 Killed, and a Cornet with feveral others wounded. Thefe advices add, that the Grand Vifier had fent fereral thousand Janifaries, with a great many Wagons, laden with Matenals, to repair the Bridge of Effecke, on which they began to work the 16th inflant, a Body of Horfe and Dragoons being 10thed near Effecke to cover the Workmen. The Furks had likewife orders from the Grand Vifier to lay a Bridge over the Drave, but Major-General Dunewaldt was marching that 4vay with feveral Imperial Regiments to obferve them.

Hamburg, May 27. The Letters from Postdam tell us, that the Electoral Prince and Princess of Brandenburg were gone to the Bath at Carelsbad in Bohemia; and that they arrived the 16th Instant at Lespsic in their journey thither. The two Deputies which the Magiltrates of this City fent to Vienna about a year ago, returned hither yesterday. The Advices from Poland fay, the Troops of that Crown were all arrived at the general Rendezvous, where they expected the Forces of Lythuania, who were on their march to joyn them.
