His laft week arrived fafely here one veffel belonging to this Port from the Canaries, and another from Mederas ; and one Friday laft a ship from Bilbao bound for London. Several ships from London and other Ports are here outwards

bound, expecting only favourable weather. Minehead, Fan. 7. The Fortune of Cork with the Abra-ham of this Port, arriving the 4th inftant, laden with Wooll from Jreland, informs us of a Spanish vellel bound for Briftol, which having spent her fore-Mast and Mizen, was riding under the Isle of Lundy, but the next night proving more then ufually ftormy, they fear the may have ran much hazard.

Turin, Decemb. 17. The Pope having taken notice of the Duke of Savoy's Refolution of recalling the Marquels Fille from the Venetian Service, and confidering how ulefull and advantageous the prefence and conduct of the faid Marquels has been to the long befieged City of Candia, was pleas'd by his Nuncio to fignifie to the Duke his defires, that the Marquels might still continue his Employment in *Candia*, at leaft for fo long time as the danger of that place should require the affistance of so able a person; which was accordingly obey'd by the Nuncio, and as wilingly condescended to by the Duke; especially the same instan-ces having been made to him by the Cardinal Rospigliof, and confirmed by a Brief from the Pope to the fame effect : but the danger being in some measure past over, the Dake has now declared a neceffity of his prefence at home, with the forces which he there entertain'd under his Command ; whole return is in little time expected ; but as yet it is not known how far the Duke may be perfwaded to engage him-felf in the Interefts of his most Christian Majesty.

Rome, Decemb. 24. On Sunday last, the Pope, with the Colledge of Cardinals, heard Masse and a Sermon in his own Chappel, and the fame afternoon paffed in his Coach to visit St. Peters Church, accompany'd by the Cardinals Gorpigna and Saluzzi, and followed by a great Train of the Princes and Nobility on Horfe-back.

His Holinels has lately disposed of several Officers and Commands ; having declared Sr. Cavaliere Nicolo Banchieri, Lieutenant-General of his Gallies, Seignior Bal-dassani Panciatici Lieutenant of his Guards, Seignior Emilio Captain of the two Companies of his Launces, Antonio St. Croce of his Horse-Guards, and Cavaliere Spinola Captain of his Troop of Cuiraffiers ; befides which he has conferred the Charge of Deputy-Governour of the Fort di St. Angelo, upon Cavaliere Monteveccht ; the Government of his Maritime and In-land Provinces, upon Ca-valiere Theodoro Celles; the Government of the Arms in his Patrimonial Province upon Seignior Lanfredino Cil-lefe; the Serjeant-Majorship for the same place upon Sebastiana Gallo, the fame employment in Romagna on Seignior Vincenzo Cellefe, the Command of 2 Troop of Horfe in Autgnon upon Cavalie e Maida'chino; making the Sr. Ottavio Adami, Serjeant-Major of the Armes in Dalmatia, and the Abbot Scarlatti Auditor for the Gallies.

On Thursday morning the Pope held a Publick Confistory , where the New Cardinals Respigliosi and Sigismundo Chizi, were introduced by the Descon Cardinal's to kifs the Hand, Eye, and Foot of his Holinefs; who em-bracing them with the reft of the Cardinals, all of them og ther weat thence into the Popes Chappel; where at

the Altar the New Cardinals took the Usual Oath, with the accustomed Ceremonies ; which done, they returned awhich Solemnity endings, who gave them and put on their Hatss which Solemnity ending, Cardinal Rofpigliofi returned to his Apartment, where he treated with an Extraordinary Banquet the Cardinals Flavio and Sigifmundo Chigi, with feveral perfons of his Kindred, and the fame afternoon, the two New Cardinals gave their first Visit to St. Peters Pallace.

This Week the Ministers of Forreign Princes refiding here, made their private Vilies to the New Cardinal Patron, who received them to their great fatisfaction ; the French and Spanish Ambassadors are daily dispatching Conriers to their respective Masters; which gives the Gene-rality some reason to believe the Treaty between them may advance, the Pope using all diligence imaginable to en-courage it. The Nuncio's for Spain, France, and other places, are not yet declared, nor will be till after the Holy-dayes.

Dantzick, Decemb. 28 Letters from Thorne confirm to us the Reception of the King of Poland's Letters; by which he affures them of his readinels to with-draw his Garrilon out of that Town, upon condition that the Bur-gers shall for the future quit all their pretentions to St. Facobs Church, permit the Jeluits the liberty of making their Proceffions, and promile to take in another Garrilon, when it shall be found convenient.

From Warfam we are advised that the Tartarian Ambaffador is difmitted from that Court, with an answer to this effect, That his Majefty will endeavour at the next enfuing Diet, to procure from the States a Ratification of the Treaty of Podaiaty.

The Ambassador from the Gzar of Muscovy is treated, with more than Ordinary Entertainment at the Court, where he endeavours to have the Ratification of the Treaty of Peace la ely concluded with his Mafter, confirmed by his Majesties Oath, and 'tis faid, promiles his affistance to the Crown of *Poland* of 30000 men, which shall be rea-dy the next year in the Field, if the affairs of *Poland* re-quite it; which offer 'tis believed may find acceptance, they having but little confidence that the peace lately made with the Tartars, can be of any long continuance.

The Army of the Crown is now retiring towards the Mafule, intending to take up their Quarters in Prussas of whole arrival, thole Countries are extreamly apprehensive, by reason of the great Disorders and little Discipline used amongft them.

The Land-day for Pruffia is to begin tle third day of the next month at Marienburgh, in Order to the General Diet ; but what Propositions his Majefty inten Is to offer them, is not faid.

Tisfaid, There is not yet a right understanding between his Majesty and the States of Poland, the latter being somewhat jealous leaft the French interest be more prevalent at the Court then they defire.

Vienna, Dec. 30. The Internuncius from His Holinels is with much corneltnels endeavouring to create a right un-de ftanding between the Spanish and French Ambaliadors, and to bring them to a Conference, but both of them excufe themselves upon pretence that they have not as yet any instructions from their Masters, that can admit of a new familiarity, and in the mean time to order affairs, that they feldom or never meet. The Marquels de Guitry bath endeavoured to affure His Imperial Majefly, that the King his Mafter intends not the least bostility against the Empire, in 9 Q.

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
