To the QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty.

Most Gracious Sovereign,

WE, your Majesty's loyal and dutiful subjects, the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Leeds, in the county of York, in special Council assembled, humbly approach your Majesty to tender our deep and heartfelt sympathy on the great bereavement your Majesty has sustained by the death of Her Royal Highness The Duchess of Kent.

In approaching your Majesty with this our most sincere expression of condolence, we humbly add our belief that to Her late Royal Highness we are more especially indebted for that judicious care and training of your Majesty's early years, which have resulted in the development of those great principles and virtues which, under Divine Providence, have tended to make your Majesty's reign a blessing not only to your own people, but to the whole civilized world.
