of Kilkenny, and of Woollas Hall; in the parish of Elkington, in the county of Worcester, Esquire, in the Commission of the Peace, and a Deputy-Lieutenant for the said county of Kilkenny, Her Royal licence and authority that he may discontinue to use his paternal surname of Lloyd, and take and use that of Hanford, in addition to and immediately before that of Flood, and that he may

be called and known by the names of William Hanford-Flood, and that the surnames of Hanford-Flood only may, in like manner, be taken, borne, and used by his issue:

And to command that the said Royal concession and declaration be recorded in Her Majesty's College of Arms, otherwise to be void and of none effect.

The above-mentioned grains, meals, and other alimentary substances, and also potatoes, are exempted from export duties by the same Decree, which likewise provides that grains and meals arriving from abroad may be deposited in private bonded stores. It is further provided that such of the provisions of the Decree of the 22nd August last, relating to the importation of grains and meals, and of the Decree of the 5th December last, relating to the importation of dried vegetables and their meals, as are more favourable than those of the present Decree, shall continue in force until the 30th September next.
