THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Ambassador at Paris, enclosing a copy of a French Imperial Decree authorizing the importation, free of duty, under the conditions specified by Article V of the law of 5th July, 1836, of pieces of unbleached tissues of wool, pure or mixed with cotton, hair, or silk, intended to be printed in France for re-exportation only.

The re-exportation of the tissues, when printed, must take place within a period in no case exceeding six months.
