THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade, have received

from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from the Spanish Minister for Foreign Affairs, announcing that in consequence of representations made by Her Majesty's Government as to the hardship of exacting fines from vessels in ballast presenting themselves in the Ports of Cuba, without being provided with certificates from Spanish Consuls, the Spanish Government have seen fit to remit the fines levied on certain British vessels, but it is expressly stated that these remissions are to be considered as Special Acts of Grace and not as precedents for future cases.

It is important therefore that all British vessels proceeding to the Ports of Cuba should be provided with such Certificates.

THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, - 1858.

DRONFIELD, DERBYSHIRE.

Now, therefore, I, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, do, hereby give notice that the Local Government Act, 1858, has been duly adopted within the aforesaid part of the said township of Dronfield, commonly known as the Dronfield Highway Boundary, and that in accordance with the provisions thereof, the said Act will at the expiration of two months from the date of the passing of the aforesaid resolution, have the force of law within such part of the said township of Dronfield.
