From the Imperial Camp at Darda, June 25. The Duke of Lotrain arrived the 22th at Mohacz, where his High-nels commanded a Bridge of Communication to be made over the Danube, and at the fame time dispatched Orders to the Generals of the Army on the Drave, to secure themselves of the Bridge made over that River near Syclos, and to make another joining to it with what Boats they had with whem: All which being performed, accordingly his Highness continued his march toward this place, where he arrived yellerday 1 and the same day he was reinforced by 4 Regiments, viz. two of Culvassers, one of Dragoons, and one of toot. And the E Regiments that were on their march from the Frontiers of Transilvania, were hourly expected. At the approach of the Imperial Army, the Turks retired in great disorder opt of the Low Grounds about this place, and made no stop till they had passed the River over their Bridge of Boats. We do not hear but that the whole Country between the Theysse and the Dan be is now freed from all Excursions of the Enemy; fince General Heuster's late Rencounter with the Tartais near Kerkemer. It is now faid, they did not make a stand long enough to loose many of their number; but that upon the fift appearance of our Troops, they betook themselves to the spees

diest retreat towards Peter Waradin, leaving behind them whatever could retard their flight: By which means Agria and Mongaiz are left still to connict with their necessities, which are so great, That the Bassa of Agria hath chosen rather to turn loose feveral Prisoners than lessen the Provisions of the Garison by seeding them. The Elector of B. waria is now encamped about Segedin, to be so much nearer either to oppose any new attempt of the Enemy on that fide, or to join the Duke of Lorrain if it shall be found necessary. We have an account that Teckeley, fince his Alarm at Kereck, was gone to Great Waradin, and had received some Money there of the Bassa, which he had distributed among his Officers; and they had employed it to procure him about 600 Men from the Neighbourhood of Mingaix; Infomuch, that he was now at the head of 1500 Men, as well Turks and Tartars, as Hungarians. There is a Report that the Duke of Lorrain, hath actually pal-fed the Drave between Sycles and Five Chinches. And that the Grand Visier is likewise marching with a numerous Army.

Vienna, June 29. Count Martiritz parted the 26th Instant Post for Heydelborg, to Compliment the Queen of Portugal on her Matriage, in the name of their Imperial Majesties. The Prince of Newtoning, Grand Maller of the Teutomique-Order, arrived here the 16th Instant, and is preparing to part again within few days for Hungary, whither his Equipage is gone before. The Duke of Mannua is daily expected here, who deligns also to pass the Campagne in the Army. They write from Lower Hungary, that the Duke of Lorrain was fill drawing nearer to the Drave: That his Army conflicted 25000 Men, whereof 9000 were Foot, and the rest Hosse and Dragoons, and that it was daily augmented by feveral Froops fent down the Danube; and it is believed, that it was now joined by the 6 Regiments from the Frontiers of Transilvania, under the Command of Count Veterani. General Denewald hath another Army of 8000 Men at Sycles, besides the Melitia of Croatia, and the Country about Care stad. The Trucks have not yet sinished their Bridge at Essecke, as was given out, but we e still at work on their repairs, and in fortifying

themselves: It is said there are but 6000 Men at Effec; e besides the ordinary Garison.

Vienna, July 3. We have advice, That General Vezi had set to acquaint the Duke of Lorrain, that by an Albannie who had rendred himself, he was informed, That Huffan Baffa was on his march towards Effeck with an Army of 5,0000 Men. It is now faid, that the Elector of Bavarla had poffed the Danube with his Army, and was gone to join the Duke of Lorrain.
