To Her Most Gracious Majesty QUEEN VICTORIA.

May it please your Majesty,

WE, the President and Council of the National Rifle Association, of which His Royal Highness the late Prince Consort was Patron, venture humbly to approach your Majesty in your deep affliction and bereavement with the expression of our heartfelt sympathy and sorrow. No words of human sympathy can indeed lighten the blow which has so suddenly fallen upon your Majesty and your Royal House; God alone can give your Majesty strength and courage to bear it. But in after years it may perhaps be a comfort to your Majesty to reflect that the irreparable loss which your Majesty has sustained in the death of the Prince Consort was acutely felt in every home throughout the land, and that your faithful and devoted people mourned in heartfelt sympathy with your Majesty and in deepest sorrow for themselves.

That God may strengthen and support your Majesty is the earnest prayer of the President and Council of this Association.
