**T**HE following Addresses and Resolutions of Condolence, on the occasion of the death of His Royal Highness The Prince Consort, have been transmitted to the Right Honourable Sir George Grey, Baronet, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, to be laid before the Queen.

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty.

WE, your Majesty's dutiful subjects, the Archbishop and Clergy of the diocese of York, desire to approach your Majesty with the expression of our most respectful sympathy and condolence under the deep affliction with which it has pleased Almighty God to visit your Majesty and the Royal Family.

We are persuaded that we are but giving utterance to sentiments shared by every one of our fellow-subjects, when we state that, by the lamented decease of the Prince Consort, we have lost one of the brightest examples, and one of the most consistent promoters of good that ever adorned a royal station.

It scarcely becomes us to speak of those less prominent virtues which we believe to have been daily exercised in the sacred privacy of domestic life, and yet we are conscious that a pattern was there set by the Prince Consort which it were well should be followed by every English family and household.

But on the Prince's claims to public gratitude and admiration we may not be silent; for, in common with the whole nation, we have now to mourn the absence of the discerning patron of art, the assiduous promoter of science, the fosterer of every pursuit which can refine the taste and elevate the character—the advocate of every institution by which our social system can be ameliorated.

To us, however, as Ministers of Christ's Church, it more especially belongs, to honour and cherish the memory of him who, by his public countenance and counsel, effectually seconded the efforts of the Church for the extension of the gospel—proved himself the constant friend of the poor, and, by the promotion of piety and virtue, contributed to the advancement of the moral and religious condition of all classes of your Majesty's subjects.

We trust that your Majesty may derive some slight solace and relief under the burden of present

sorrow, from the manifest tokens, that it is with no mere outward semblance of mourning, but from the depths of a loyal and attached heart, that a grateful people now deplores the loss of a Prince who shed a lustre on royalty by the noble use of opportunities which his exalted station afforded him.

But it is our more earnest hope that the prayers of ourselves and your Majesty's faithful subjects in general may so be answered that those consolations of Divine Grace in Christ Jesus, which the Saviour has mercifully promised to all the weary and heavy laden who come to him for rest, may be abundantly vouchsafed to your Majesty and the Royal Family, to the comfort and edification of your souls in this season of sore trial and affliction.

MY LORD, (Received January 15, 1862).  
THE Secretary of State of the United States has informed me that, having learned that Messrs. J. W. Zacharie and T. J. Rogers, American citizens, were taken from a vessel called the "Eugenia Smith," under the British flag, and under circumstances similar to those involved in the case of Messrs. Mason and Slidell, and that they are now confined in Fort Lafayette, he has caused orders to be given for their discharge, and permission for them to return to Norfolk, in Virginia, by way of Fortress Monroe.

Extract of a Despatch from Lord Lyons to Earl Russell.

I HAVE the honor to enclose, herewith, to your Lordship a copy of a note from Mr. Seward to the Secretary of the Navy, which has been communicated to me to-day by Mr. Seward, referring to the fact of a British schooner, the "James Campbell," captured for breach of blockade, having been brought into New York, with the British flag flying under that of the United States; Mr. Seward condemns this act in the strongest terms; the act was disavowed with equal promptitude by the naval authorities of the United States, under whose notice it was brought.

SIR.

THIS Department has received unofficial information that the schooner "James Campbell," captured by the blockading squadron, was carried into New York with the British flag flying under that of the United States. This unseemly act must have been occasioned by a misapprehension of his duty by the officer who ordered or allowed it. I will, consequently, thank you to give such orders as may tend to prevent a repetition of the same.

"I HAVE the honor to enclose, herewith, to you a copy of a note from Mr. Seward to the Secretary of the Navy, which has been communicated to me to-day by Mr. Seward. It refers to the circumstances of an oath having been exacted as a condition of release, by the Commander of the

United States steamer, from three British seamen, captured for breach of blockade, to the effect that they should undertake not to be employed in similar proceeding for the future. Your Lordship will see that Mr. Seward strongly condemns this act, and releases the seamen from the obligation taken by them."

To the Honourable Gideon Welles.

SIR,

"THIS Department has been informally apprized that Commander Woodhall, of the United States steamer "Connecticut," recently exacted as a condition of the release of members of the crew of the British schooner "Adeline," captured for a breach of the blockade, that they should enter into an engagement not to be employed in a similar proceeding in future. It occurs to this Department that, as the requirement referred to is not warranted by public law, the commanders of blockading vessels should be instructed not to exact any similar condition for the release of persons found on board vessels charged with a breach of the blockade. It may be lawful to detain such persons as witnesses, when their testimony may be indispensable to the administration of justice; but when captured in a neutral ship, they cannot be considered, and ought not to be treated, as prisoners of war. Angus Smith, John Mooney, and John H. McHenry, the alleged British subjects above referred to, are consequently to be considered as absolved from the obligation represented to have been required of them by Commander Woodhall.
