THE following Address of Condolence on the occasion of the death of His Royal Highness the Prince Consort, which has been transmitted to the Right Honourable Sir George Grey, Baronet, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, has been laid before the Queen by Sir George Grey, and has been received very graciously by Her Majesty :

To the QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty.

WE, the Archbishops and Bishops of the Irish Provinces of the United Church of England and Ireland, humbly tender to your Majesty our heartfelt sympathy under the affliction with which your Majesty has been visited.

In common with all your Majesty's faithful and attached subjects, we are filled with sorrow at the removal of one so beloved by your Majesty, and to whom the nation owed so great a debt of gratitude. We grieve for the bereavement of the Royal Family, and deeply feel that the country has lost in the Prince Consort its foremost example of domestic virtue, of prudence as an adviser, wisdom as a parent, refined taste as a patron of the Arts, and untiring zeal as an improver of the condition of the poor. "Whatsoever things are pure, whatsoever things are lovely, whatsoever things are of good report, if there be any virtue, and if there be any praise," the Prince Consort "thought on these things." And throughout your Majesty's wide dominions the memory of His Royal Highness will ever be gratefully cherished and revered.

To the Divine Comforter, the Holy Spirit, whom the Blessed Redeemer has promised to send for the consolation of the suffering members of His Church on earth, we earnestly commend your Majesty in our several and united prayers, beseeching Him to vouchsafe to your Majesty the succour and strength, the meek resignation, and the patience of hope, which your Majesty requires in this time of need.
