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Rome, July 5.

THIS week several Congregations have been held in Presence of the Pope, upon the occasion of the *Quintists*. The Prince of *Avellino* was Married the 29th past, with a Daughter of the Marquis de los *Balbaces*, they are since gone for *Naples* with the Duke of *Mazelone*, in the same Gally that brought the Spanish Ambassador the Marquis de *Cogolludo*, to *Gazeta*, who arrived here the 3 Instant, and it is expected that he will soon appear in publick according to his Character. The Bishop of *Primsilia*, Ambassador from *Poland*, hath had two Audiences of his Holiness, since his arrival here, making use of the Coaches and Equipage of Cardinal *Barbarin* Protector of that Kingdom.

Genova, July 7. The 5th Instant 17 Gallies arrived in this Port from *Marseilles*, under the Command of the Chevalier de *Noailles*, who, after the usual Salutes past, received a Compliment from the Senate by their Deputy *Augustino Spinola*. They write from *Turin*, that the Nobility there had been in great concern, upon a report that the Duke of *Savoy* intended to reunite to his Domain the Revenue called *il Tasso*, which some of his Predecessors had alienated, in favour of several Families, pretending the same is inseparable from the Sovereignty, and could not be granted away to the prejudice of the Successor. The Marquis d'*Uffe*, Son of the Marquis de *Conflans*, was return'd from *Venice* to *Milan*, and was shortly to go thither again, in order to Command the 4 Milanese Regiments in the *Morea*; three whereof have been lately Reformed by General *Morofini*, but are now again to be re-established.

Venice, July 18. They write from *Dalmatia*, that a Grecian sent to *Dulcigno*, to Treat about the Ransom of the Sieur *Barocci*, Chief Magistrate of *Crozza Nuova*, who had been lately taken out of his own House, by those Pirates in the Marquisate of *Ancona*, had agreed for 4000 Sequins for his Liberty, which were to be paid at *Cattaro*, in the Arch-Bishoprick of *Ragusa*. They write from *Tras* in *Dalmatia*, that the Bassa of *Bosnia* being joyned by three other Bassas, was advanced as far as *Clinovo*, with an Army of 14000 Men. That the Sangiac of *Arcegovina* was also conducting Artillery thither, with design to attack some of our Forts. But General *Cornaro* was vigilant to observe the Enemies motions, who expected to be reinforced by the Troops of *Istria*, which were on their march; As also, with those of the Elector of *Saxony*, which are lately returned from the *Levant*, and are now making their Quarantine here, and when that is done, 'tis believed they will be order'd to *Dalmatia*: Since the differences which have been with his Electoral Highness in this matter are now compos'd, and with these Forces there is a probability that there may be an attempt made upon *Castlenovo*, in the Gulf of *Cattaro*, wherein the *Albanese* will willingly assist; who being dispos'd to throw off the *Ottoman* yolk, would readily joyn to recover that place out of the hands of the Turks, who have made use of it as a Bridle upon them hitherto. The Sieur *Giovanne*

Loydano is sail'd with the three Gallies that carry Money for the payment of the Troops in *Dalmatia*, where he intends to serve as a Volontier. A Captain of a Vessel lately arriv'd from the *Levant* reports, that General *Morofini* was at *St. Mare* with his Fleet, just ready to sail for some considerable undertaking. That the Contagion was absolutely ceased, and therefore he had sent for the Auxiliary Squadrons from *Orranto* to joyn him. That he had sent 900 Foot to *Napoli di Romania*. There are arriv'd at the *Lido* about 2000 Men, whom the Prince of *Bareit* of the House of *Brandenburg* had undertaken to raise for the service of this State; and there are more arriv'd at *Verone*, sent from the Landgrave of *Hesse*, with 400 Horse at *Trevise*, so that within a few days there will be another Convoy sent under the Conduct of the Sieur *Giovanne Morofini*, who is to continue Proveditor in the Province of *Maina* in the *Morea*. The Sieur *Girolamo Venier*, Ambassador from this State in *France*, was named the 10th Instant, to go in the same quality to the Emperor's Court, there to relieve the Sieur *Frederic Cornaro*.

Lembourg, June 24. It is not yet certain whither the King will go in Person to the Field this Campaign. The Sieur *Jablanowski* Crown-General, parted from hence the 18th Instant for the Army: Here runs a report that the Vanguard of the *Moscovite* Army in their march into *Chrim Tartary*, had a shock with the *Tartars*, in which several thousands were killed on both sides, but more of the *Moscovites* than *Tartars*.

Vienna, July 13. We have had no Letters from the Imperial Army in *Hungary* since the 3d Instant, which is imputed to the overflowing of the Waters, through the excessive Rains in the Rivers which the Courier has to pass, or that he is taken by some of the Parties from *Alba Regalis*, who make frequent Excursions; there has not been known so wet a Season for many years, but since the 27th past it has ceas'd to rain, and the weather has held fair after it, so that the Waters now beginning to sink to their old level, we may expect to hear of the prosecution of those Designs, which this unexpected accident hath interrupted. They write from *Zabmar*, that the Bassa of *Great Waradin* had been before *St. Job* with about 4000 Horse and Foot, as well Turks as *Tartars*; but finding the Garrison well prepared to receive them, they were retir'd again with the loss of 60 Men, whose dead Bodies they carried away in 5 Wagons, there being only 3 of the Garrison wounded, and none killed. We hear that a considerable Party sallying from *Mongatz*, under the Command of that notorious Rebel *Andrew Raditz*, with intentions to dive the Country, and carry off all the Cattle they could find, met with a Body of *Hungarians* in their return, who aving notice of their Design, had way-laid them, and after an obstinate resistance, having killed many of the Rebels, they took 150 of them prisoners, and only 4 of them got back into *Mongatz*, of which number was their Captain *Andrew*. And the *Hungarians* missing one of their own Captains, who happened to be killed in this Rencounter, in a rage they killed their prisoners, not sparing one.

1705, July 15. The French are very busy at work on the Fort of *Mont Royal* near *Traerbach*, which is expected to be in a condition of Defence within few Months. The Treasurer-General regulated there the 10th Instant the value of German Money, reducing it to the French Standard.

Hannover, July 19. The Conferences between the Ministers of *Brandenburg*, and those of *Saxe-Lewenbourg* concerning the Tolls upon the *Elbe*, have not had all the success that was expected, and there is a probability of their separation without coming to any conclusion. The first choosing rather to leave things in the condition they now stand, than to prejudice the Rights pretended to by his Electoral Highness, by entering on a Treaty in the manner it is proposed. The preliminary Points that were first to be adjusted before the opening of the Conferences at *Altena*, in the differences between the King of *Denmark* and Duke of *Holslein Gottorp* were not yet settled. It is said the Prince Elector of *Brandenburg* had been at *Brunswick* and *Hannover* on a visit to his Father-in-law; and that the Electoral Princefs had a Miscarriage at *Voigtstalem*, near *Wolfenbuttel*. The Prisoners *Crollan*, *Jarchau*, *Keifer*, and *Alexander*, accused as Principals in the late disorders here, were brought yesterday to receive their Sentence, which is, That the first should be banish'd from this City and Territory, for the space of 30 years, with a confiscation of half his Estate. That the two next should be banished for 10 years, and pay a Fine of 1000 Crowns each. That the last should suffer banishment for the like term of 10 years, and be Fined 1000 Florins. They write from *Copenhagen*, that the Vice-Admiral *Gedde* was sailed with 7 Men of War, in order to cruise against the Corsairs, that have done lately considerable damage on the *North* Coasts, and that they were fitting out other Ships to make up the number of 12 in all. We hear from *Holland*, that the *Danish* Officers have all Orders to repair forthwith to their respective Quarters. The Letters from *Lundun* in *Sweden* of the 8th Instant, say, That the King of *Sweden* was then at *Comsar*, to see his Troops that are encamped there, and that his Guards were marched towards *Lagvenland*, where they were to continue till his Majesty's arrival, who would take the Review of them, and see them Exercise. That they were busy in ordering their three Camps, which were to be formed, by the 21st of this Month.

Cologne, July 20. The Magistrates of this City have lost their Cause before the Chamber of *Spira*, whereby they pretended to subject the Ecclesiastics to the payment of the same Duties and Excise with the other Inhabitants. Our last Letters from the Army in *Lower Hungary* gave an account of the easy Victory the Imperialists had obtain'd over the Turks at *Darda*, making themselves Masters of their Bridge and Forts, with the loss of very few Men, which helps to confirm the Opinion, that the Turks do not intend to make an Offensive War this Campaign. And that Bridge which the Turks had been so busy these 8 Months to repair, employing many thousand hands in the work, which they had so framed by Timber and Earth intermixed, mutually supporting and securing one the other, that it would have been out of danger of being destroyed by Fire, as was the former, which was made only of Wood, and might, if finished, have been made tenable against a considerable Force; is now at leisure pulling in pieces, whereby that great and only passage into *Hungary*, at least for Artillery, will be totally taken away. And this Success might in all appearance have been followed with much greater, if the continual Rains had not raised the waters, so as to make the *Drave* unpassable, notwithstanding they had a provision of Boats sufficient for three Bridges; espe-

cially if there be, (as is represented) that destination at *Essecke*, as to talk of quitting it upon the first appearance of the Duke of *Lorraine* on that side of the River; as also that the Grand Visier has not stirred from *Belgrade*, but continues there with a small Army, expecting the arrival of the Asiatick Troops.

Hague, July 25. We have no advice as yet of the Queen of *Portugal*'s arrival at *Rotterdam*, but that some of her Domestiques were already come, who report that She was following, and would be ready to go on board His Majesty's Yachts tomorrow. The Prince of *Orange* having taken his round in visiting the places which he purposed to see, has been now for some days with her Royal Highness at *Loos*, where they intend to pass most of the remaining part of the Summer. The 22d Instant the States of *Holland* and *West-Friesland* Adjourned to the 10th of *September* next, and the Deputies are gone to their respective homes; in the mean time the Committees from the several Colleges of the Admiralty continue their Conferences with the Deputies of the States, in matters relating to the Sea. On the 23d the Herring-Busses sailed from the *Texel* with their Convoy. There is a *Moscovite* Ambassador just come to *Amsterdam*, who hath given Notice to the States of his arrival.

Paris, July 26. The 20th of this Month the Marquis *Doghiani*, Ambassador Extraordinary from the Duke of *Savoy* made his publick Entry here, having been received at *Picpus* by the Marschal d'*Humieres*, Grand Master of the Artillery, and the Sieur de *Bonevil* Master of the Ceremonies, in the Coaches of His Majesty, and the Dauphiness. He had his Audience of the King, &c. on the 22d Instant, being conducted thereunto by the said Marschal d'*Humieres*, and Sieur de *Bonevil*. His Majesty has given the Government of *Lorraine*, vacant by the death of Marschal *Craqui*, to the Marquis of *Baisfers*, who was before Governor of *Luxembourg*, which Government is given to the Sieur *Catinat*, formerly Commander of *Casal*; And the Marquis de *Remy* is made the King's Lieutenant in *Franche Comte*, in the place of the Sieur de *Montauban* deceased. The King went this day with the Dauphin to *Meissenom*, and is not expected back at *Verfailles* till the 30th Instant.
