SIR,  
I have to inform you that it has been deemed expedient to rescind the order issued in consequence of the state of affairs in this country, making it necessary for all persons leaving the United States to provide themselves with passports, and you will therefore be pleased to consider that arrangement as being terminated. It will therefore be left optional with persons to provide themselves with passports or not, as they may deem necessary for their protection and security abroad. Foreign passports will no longer require to be countersigned.
