The term "Postal District of the Prince of Tour and Taxis," used in this Warrant, shall include the States and Countries of Frankfort on the Maine, the Grand Duchy of Hesse, Hesse Electoral, Hesse Homburg, Schaumburg Lippe, Lippe Detmold, Nassau, Reuss, Saxe Coburg-Gotha, Saxe-Meiningen, Saxe-Weimar, Eisenach, Hohenzollern, Schwartzburg, Rudolstadt, and Schwartzburg Sonderhausen, and the other terms and expressions used in this Warrant, shall be construed to have the like meaning in all respects as they would have had if inserted in the said recited Warrant of the 19th day of July, 1852.

6. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of April, 1862.

The Commissioners for the time being of Her Majesty's Treasury may, by Warrant under their hands, duly made at any time hereafter, alter, repeal, or revoke any of the rates of postage hereby altered, or the regulations hereby made, and may make and establish any new or other rates or regulations in lieu thereof, and from time to time appoint at what time the rates which may be payable are to be paid.
