LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1858.

NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF ACT BY MORLEY, IN THE COUNTY OF YORK.

WHEREAS the Local Government Act, 1858, was duly adopted, on the 15th day of March, 1862, by the township of Morley, in the parish of Batley, in the county of York; and notice of such adoption has been duly given, in writing, to me, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, as required by such Act; and whereas it

has now been duly certified to me that a copy of such notice has been advertized for three successive weeks in the Leeds Mercury, that being one of the local newspapers published and circulated in the aforesaid township, and that copies of such notice have also been affixed to the principal doors of each church and chapel in such township to which notices are usually affixed; and the period of twenty-one days fixed by the said Act for appeal against the resolution for the adoption of the said Act by such township has now expired, and no such appeal has been duly made as required by the Act:

Now, therefore, I, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, do hereby give notice, that the Local Government Act, 1858, has been duly adopted within the aforesaid township of Morley, in the county of York, and that, in accordance with the provisions thereof, the said Act will, at the expiration of two months from the date of the passing of the aforesaid resolution, have the force of law within such township of Morley.
