An Act for raising the sum of one million pounds by Exchequer Bonds for the service of the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-two.

An Act to extend the time for making enrolments under the Act passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to amend the law relating to the conveyance of land for charitable uses," and to explain and amend the said Act.

An Act to extend to the Isle of Man the provisions of the Act eighteenth and nineteenth Victoria, chapter ninety, as to the payment of costs to and by the Crown.
