To the King's most Excellent Majesty,

The Humble Address of the Grand Jurors at the Affize held at Okeham for the County of Rutland, July 8. 1687.

Dread Soveraign,

E being met this day to inquire for Your Naajesty, and the Body of this County, find fuch fatisfactory Eafe in the performance of this our Duty, by Your Majesties most Gracious Declara-

tion, which hath Charitably removed from us all Obligations of Presenting Men for Conscience fake; that confidering the feverity, and yet the necessity of that burden we were uneasie under, do with all Humility offer our unfeigned Thanks, and Laud the Majesty of Heaven that hath fet fuch a King over us, who hath not only made our Service in this capacity far more acceptable than before; but hath alfo given Life to our Trade, by Liberty to our fellow Christians, and His Royal Word, (the beft Secu-rity under God Almighty) to maintain the eftablished Religion of the Church of England; All which most Jensible and Gracious Biessings, as they represent Tour Majefty to be defign'd by Heaven for the general Peace and Happiness of the Nation; so do they Command the most heraty and sincere Obedience of Your Majefties most Dutiful and Loyal Subjects.

To the King's most Excellent Majesty,

The Humble Address of the Non-conforming Minifters in the County Palatin of Lancaster.

E Your Majesties Loyal and Peaceable Subjects, cannot but make this grateful Recognition of Your Princely Grace in your former Proclamation for Pardon, which fome of us received fpecial relief by, under our manufold fufferings meerly upon account of our Diffent in fome things from the Church of England. We do alfo with all Humility and Thank fulness acknowledge Your So-veraign Clemency in Your late most Gracious Declaration for Indulgence, wherein Your Majely takes fuch tender Care both for Property and Liberty, that we may lead quiet and peace-ble Lives under Your Government, according to our Perfuasion and Profesfion; We on our part refolving withal, to behave our feives fo as floall not be unbecoming the Gofpel of our Lord Jefus, nor university of fuch Princely Grace from Your Royal Majefty,

Subscribed for our Selves, and on the behalf of our Brethren and People.

Rome, July 12. The Marquis de Cogolludo Ambaffador from Spain, had a private Audience of the Pope the 9th Inftant. Cardinal S uze, Native of Liege, dyed here the 7th Inftant, after a long Sicknets, in the 6oth year of his Age, which makes a 4th pince vacant in the Colledge. The 6th Initant the Julits choic for the General of their Order, Fa-

ther Thyrfo Gonzales a Spaniard. The General Congregation was composed of 86 Deputics, whereof in the fuft Scrutiny he had 34 Voices, in the next 41, and in the 3d he had 48, which made a Majo-rity for his Election.

From the Imperial Camp in Sclavonia, July 13. The 10th and 11th Inftant the feveral Works and Retrenchments made for the fecurity of our Bridges, were enlarged and perfected : About the tame time fix Turkish prisoners with 11 Houses taken by the Huffars and fent to the Duke of Lorra.n, informed his Highnels, that the Grand Vilier was encamp'd near Semlyn on this fide the Sav., towards the mouth of it, with an Army of 15000 Men, expecting the coming up of the Troops from Afia. That there were 20000 Men arrived a. Effeck, which were the fame that lay encamped at Peter Waradim. That Huffan Baffa and Latif Baffa's were within Effeck; and that the Baffa of Aleppo Commanded the Army that lay without the Town. Velt-Marshal Caprara, who was left at Darda, arrived the 11th Instant at the old Camp near Syclos, and paffed the River the next day. The Elector of Bavaria came up to our Arday. my this day, he left his Troops on the other fide the River, but with Orders to follow him, and pafs the River this day and to Morrow. The Duke of Lorrain has already begun his March, and is this day advanced with his Foot within half a League of Walpo, a pretty large Town at the diffance of two Hungarian Miles from Effeck, and one from the Drave ; the paffages being narrow, we marched in three Columns, the Horfe having Orders to follow. We are told that there is not above 350 Soldiers in this place, and that they have Orders to retire and burn the Town as foon as the Imperialists appear ke-fore it. There is a report that the Grand Vifier is expected to Morrow at Effeck with an Army of 30000 Men; We reckon the Christian Army, (now the Elector of Bavaria has joined it) to be upwards

of 50000 Men. Buda, July 17. The Troops of the Circles of Suabia and Francenta are now arrived within fight of this Town, making 7875 Men, as well Horfe as Foot, in a good condition for Service, who have Orders to march towards the Drave, under the Command of Count Rabata, who is now here, taking case of Supplies and Provisions for the Army. Count Cohari, Lieutenant-Governor of Peft has taken x Review of the Huffars and Heydukes, amounting to above 3000 Men, who are to reinforce the Blockade The skirmish mention'd in our last beof Agria. tween the Marquis Doria, and Garifon of Agita, is confirmed, with these particulars. That the Faffa being defirous to manage his Provific ns, had fent ont a Party of about 300 Men to Foldge, and bring in what they could meet with; which the Marquis Doria having Notice of, intercepted them in their return with 200 Foot, and force Dra-goons, who flew of them 160, and tool 15 prifoners. The Storms and Meteors are no great Novelties, yet what happend here the 13th and 14th Inftant, was fo extraordinary, and did to fuprize the Inhabitants, that it may not be unworthy the mentioning. Of the 13th about 8 at night there was feen in Ur. Air, a itream of Fire, of a blewith colour

consur, that hid the Thipe and windings of a Ser- f p nt, till at left it leften'd and dafappear'd as it came over against Post : And the next right there was fuch a dreadful Storm of Wind, with Thunder and Ligathu g, that two of the Town Gates on the fide of A ba R gal s were thrown open with the violence of it; the Bells and Bais, which were of a Two Cengreat thickness, being thiver'd in pieces. tinels in the Cattle were blown over the Works, and alighted again on the Counterfcarp; But the firength of the Wind that caught them up into the Air, breaking their fall, they received no hurt. Yet there was no damage done to the great numbers of Veffels that lay in the River, for they being under the shelter of the Town, the Wind coming from the West, had no .power over them, which must otherwife have made a miferable havock, there lying feveral Boats of Stores for the Army.

V 1 a, July 20. The Duke of Mantua arrived here the 14th Inftant, where he has been received with all the marks of a good welcom. The 13th Inftant was folemniz'd the Marriage of Count Leopold, eldel' Son to the Prince of Dietrichften, Steward of the Houshold to his Imperial Majefty, with a Daughter of the Prince of Salmes, the Arch-Dukes Governor. We are told that the Imperial Army paffing the Drave with that refolution, notwithitanding all the difficulties that lay in the way, and being moreover now joyned by the Elector of Bav 1ria with his Troops, had ftruck fuch a terror into the Enemy; that the Baffa of Aleppo, who Com-mands the Ottoman Army about Effeck, had not thought fit to expect the coming up of the Duke of Lorrain; but having put his Foot into the Town of Effecke, he was retreated with his Horfe towards the Grand Vifier's Camp upon the Store. And we hear further, that the Garifon at Walpo had rendred themfelves at differentian. The Christian Arms has met with that fuccels in their Deligns undertaken hitherto, that they do already begin to entertain themfelves with the confiderations of what is to be done after the taking of Effeck; concluding that things are fo well laid, that this place cannot escape them.

Paris, Aug. 2. His Majefly went the 26th of the last Month to Maintenon, and returned again the 30th. This week was published here a Decree, bear-ing Date the 18th of July, enjoyning that the Laws now in force against Gaming be put in execution; And ftrictly forbidding all Persons, of what Rank or Quality loever, to use or allow any Gaming in their Houses, more particularly the Games of Hoca, Baffett, or Lanfquenett, under the penalty of 3000 Livres for the first Fault, and a greater Sum for any after Convictions, as is fet forth more at large in the fuid Decree.A Lieutenant-Colonel of a Regiment of Foot is condemned by a Judgment of the Marthals of France, to an Imprifonment for 25 years, the payment of 2000 Crowns for Repairation, and to be degraded from being a Gentleman; for having ftruck with a Cane, a Son of one of the Kings Life-Guards. They write from Cadiz, that the New Sp.in Fleet Sailed from thence the 3d of the laft Month,

P'ymouth, July 24. Yefterday in the Evening arrived in this Harbor, the Wind being contrary, his Grace the Differ of Grafton, with a Squadron of His Mnjefties Ships under his Command, and this day the Wind coming about to the N. W. he fet Sail again for Port 19.1; and the fame day arrived here His Maiefties Ship-the P. haniv, Captain Three Commander from the E.ft-Ind. 25, after a Voyage of about 4 years.

Yesterday arrived here an Express from Rome with an acc unt, that Her Highnels the Dichefs of M long, the Queens Mother, died there the 19.h Instant, after 11 days fickness, in the 53 year of her age. This day the Caunt de Kaunit; Envoy Extraordinary from the Emperer, had his Audience o' Le. ve of His Majefty at Windfer, being conducted by Sir Charles Centrel Matter of the Geremonies, in the usual manner.
