Five cubic feet, not exceeding $2\frac{1}{2}$ cwt., to be rated as a barrel bulk; but when the weight of 5 cubic feet is greater than $2\frac{1}{2}$ cwt., then $2\frac{1}{3}$ cwt. to be rated as a barrel bulk.

The rates for wharfage will include the use of cranes, if required. Should the use of the cranes be required for any purpose other than the shipping or unshipping of goods mentioned in the preceding table, the use of them will be charged for as per agreement.
