DESPATCHES, of which the following are copies, have been received from Vice-Admiral Sir James Hope, the Commander-in-chief of Her Majesty's Ships on the East India and China Station, relating to the capture of Tsing-pu and Najaor, near Shanghai, from the Taepings :

TAKING OF THE TOWN OF TSING-PU FROM THE REBELS.

No. 194. *Coromandel, Shanghai,*
 My Lord, *May 13, 1862.*

YOU will be pleased to acquaint the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that the force noted below was collected on the 9th instant, under the command of Brigadier-General Staveley,

about two miles below Tsing-pu, and that the town was captured on the morning of the 12th, the operations having been delayed by wet weather, which rendered the ground impracticable for 24 hours.
