TAKING OF THE TOWN OF TSING-PU FROM THE REBELS.

No. 194. My Lord,

Coromandel, Shanghae, May 13, 1862.

YOU will be pleased to acquaint the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that the force noted below was collected on the 9th instant, under the command of Brigadier-General Stavely,

about two miles below Tsing-pu, and that the town was captured on the morning of the 12th, the operations having been delayed by wet weather, which rendered the ground impracticable for 24 hours.
