THE Queen, Sovereign of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, having been graciously pleased by letters patent under the Great Seal of the Order, bearing date this day, to dispense with all the Statutes and regulations observed in regard to installation, and to give and grant unto His Royal Highness Frederick William, Reigning Grand Duke of Mecklenburg Strelitz, Knight of the said Most Noble Order, full powor and authority to exercise all rights and privileges belonging to a Knight Companion of the said Most Noble Order of the Garter, in as full and ample a manner as if he had been formally installed, any decree, rule, or usage to the contrary notwithstanding.

#### Downing Street, August 13, 1862.

The Queen has been pleased to appoint Francesco Fiteni, Esq., LL.D., to be one of Her Majesty's Judges for the Island at Malta.

#### Whitehall, August 6, 1862.

The Queen has been pleased to grant unto Sir Henry Hoghton, of Hoghton Tower, in the county palatine of Lancaster, Baronet, Her Royal licence and authority that he and the other issue of his father Sir Henry Bold-Hoghton, late of Hoghton Tower aforesaid, Baronet, deceased, may take and henceforth resume the ancient patronymic of their family, by assuming and using the surname of de Hoghton, instead of that of Hoghton, and that such surname of de Hoghton may in like manner be taken, borne, and used by his and their respective issue:

And to command that the said Royal concession and declaration be recorded in Her Majesty's College of Arms, otherwise to be void and of none effect.
