## NOTIFICATION OF BLOCKADE.

**I**T is hereby notified that, on the 23rd instant, Earl Russell, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, received from the Italian Chargé d'Affaires at this Court, the announcement that the Government of the King of Italy had instituted a Blockade of the Island of Sicily and the neighbouring Islands. The following is the official communication received by Earl Russell :—
