By the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

**W**HEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament, held in the eleventh and twelfth years of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act to prevent, until the first day of September, one thousand eight hundred and fifty, and to the end of the then session of Parliament, the spreading of contagious or infectious disorders among Sheep, Cattle, and other Animals," (which Act has since been extended and continued in force until the first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, and to the end of the then next session of Parliament), after reciting that "a contagious or infectious disorder known or described as the Sheep Pox or Variola Ovina, now prevails among the sheep in some parts of the United Kingdom, and it is necessary to take Measures to prevent such disorder from spreading;" it was and is enacted (amongst other things) as follows, namely:—"In case any Sheep or Lambs infected with or labouring under the said Disorder, or any Disorder of the like Nature, be exposed or offered for sale, or be brought or attempted to be brought for the Purpose of being so exposed or offered for Sale, in any Market, Fair, or other open or public Place where other Animals are commonly exposed for Sale, then and in any such case it shall be lawful for any Clerk or Inspector or other Officer of such Fair or Market, or for any Constable or Policeman, or for any other Person authorized by the Mayor, or by any Two Justices of the Peace having Jurisdiction in the Place, or for any person authorized or appointed by Her Majesty in Council, to seize the same, and to report such Seizure to the Mayor or any Justice of the Peace having Jurisdiction in the Place; and it shall be lawful for such Mayor or Justice either to restore the same, or to cause the same, together with any Pens, Hurdles, Troughs, Litter, Hay, Straw, or other Articles which he may judge likely to have been infected thereby, to be forthwith destroyed or otherwise disposed of in such manner as he

"shall deem proper, or as may be directed in manner herein-after provided; and any Person bringing or attempting to bring any Sheep, Lambs, Oxen, Bulls, Cows, Calves, or other horned Cattle, into any such Market, Fair, or open or public Place as aforesaid, knowing such Sheep, Lambs, or Cattle to be infected with or labouring under either of such Disorders as aforesaid, shall, upon Conviction thereof, forfeit and pay for each and every such Offence a Sum not exceeding Twenty Pounds."

And whereas in and by the said Act, it was, and is further enacted as follows, that is to say:

"If any Person turn out, keep, or depasture any Sheep or Lambs infected with or labouring under the said disorder, in or upon any Forest, Chase, Wood, Moor, Marsh, Heath, Common, waste Land, open Field, Road Side, or other undivided or uninclosed Land, such person shall, on Conviction thereof, forfeit and pay any Sum not exceeding Twenty Pounds."

And whereas in and by the said Act it was and is further enacted (for the more effectually preventing the spreading of contagious or infectious disease) as follows, that is to say:—

"It shall be lawful for the Lords and others of Her Majesty's Privy Council, or any two or more of them, from time to time to make such Orders and Regulations as to them may seem necessary for the purpose of prohibiting or regulating the removal to or from such parts or places as they may designate in such Order or Orders, of Sheep, Cattle, Horses, Swine, or other Animals, or of Meat, Skins, Hides, Horns, Hoofs, or other parts of any Animals, or of Hay, Straw, Fodder, or other articles likely to propagate Infection; and also for the purpose of purifying any Yard, Stable, Outhouse, or other place, or any Waggons, Carts, Carriages, or other vehicles; and also for the purpose of directing how any Animals dying in a diseased state or any Animals, Parts of Animals, or other Things, seized under the Provisions of this Act, are to be disposed of; and also for the Purpose of causing Notices to be given of the Appearance of any Disorder among Sheep, Cattle, or other Animals, and to make any other Orders or Regulations for the Purpose of giving Effect to the Provisions of this Act, and again to revoke, alter, or vary any such Orders or Regulations; and all Provisions for any of the Purposes aforesaid, in any such Order or Orders contained, shall have the like Force and Effect

“ as if the same had been inserted in this Act ;  
 “ and all Persons offending against the same shall  
 “ for each and every Offence forfeit and pay any  
 “ Sum not exceeding Twenty Pounds, or such  
 “ smaller Sum as the said Lords or others of Her  
 “ Majesty’s Privy Council may in any Case by  
 “ such Order direct.”

And whereas a Contagious or Infectious Disorder, known or described as the Sheep Pox, or Variola Ovina, now prevails among the Sheep in some parts of the United Kingdom, and it is expedient to take measures for preventing such Disorder from spreading ;

Now, therefore, the Lords of Her Majesty’s Privy Council, do hereby, in pursuance and exercise of the powers so vested in them, as aforesaid, make and ordain the several Orders and Regulations following ; that is to say :—

## I.

It shall not be lawful for any person to remove any Sheep or Lambs to or from any or either of the parishes and tythings following, all lying and being in the county of Wilts, and near to the town of Devizes, that is to say, the parishes or tythings of

Horton,  
 Bishop’s Cannings,  
 Allcannings,  
 Etchilhampton, and  
 Allington,

or to drive or conduct any Sheep or Lambs through or by way of such parishes or tythings, or any or either of them, unless the person so removing, driving, or conducting such Sheep or Lambs shall first have obtained a certificate, in writing, signed by some person who may have been authorized by two or more Justices of the said county of Wilts to seize Sheep or Lambs infected with or labouring under the said disorders, under the 1st section of the said Act, that such removal, driving, or conducting may take place without danger of spreading the said disease.

## II.

All Sheep and Lambs dying in any of the stages of the said disease, wheresoever such death or deaths shall or may occur, shall forthwith be buried by the person or persons in whose possession such Sheep or Lambs may be at the time of death, with their skins on, in pits of not less than five feet in depth, and the carcases so buried shall be covered with quicklime.

## III.

All sheds and places whatsoever, and all railway trucks and other vehicles which may or shall have been used or occupied by Sheep or Lambs affected by the said disease, shall forthwith, after having been so used, be thoroughly cleansed with water, and immediately afterwards purified with chloride of lime by the person or persons in possession of such sheds, places, trucks, and vehicles respectively.

## IV.

Every person in possession of any Sheep or Lambs in or amongst which the said disease shall manifest itself, shall forthwith give notice, in writing, of the fact to the Chief Constable or Superintendent of Police of the county or borough, in which such Sheep or Lambs may be.

## V.

And it is further ordered that this Order shall continue in force for three calendar months from and after the date hereof.

(No. 19)—ENGLAND—SOUTH COAST.

*New Buoys in Solent Channel.*

THE Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty hereby give notice, that with a view of facilitating the navigation of the Solent Channel, the following buoys have been placed on the Salt Mead and Black Rock ledges, off the northern shore of the

Ile of Wight, and that the Hamsted ledge buoy on the same shore has been shifted to the north-east end of the ledge.

*Salt Mead Ledge.*

A *white* buoy is placed in 5 fathoms at low water on the north-east edge of the ledge, with Egypt point bearing E.  $\frac{3}{4}$  N., (the Gurnet buoy appears a little outside the point); Eaglehurst tower a little within Stansore point, N.E.  $\frac{3}{4}$  E.; Lepe coastguard houses, N.E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  N.; Pitts Deep coast-guard houses, N.W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  W., nearly; Hurst high lighthouse, W.  $\frac{3}{4}$  N.; centre of the Mount trees (east end of Yarmouth), on outer extreme of Hamsted point, W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  S.; North Close farm house, S.W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  S.; and Hamsted ledge buoy W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  N., distant 2 miles.

*Black Rock Ledge.*

A *white* buoy is placed in 10 fathoms water a little outside and to the northward of the Black rock off Yarmouth, with the high tower of the Refuge in Yarmouth in line with the north-east end of the Castle wall bearing S.E. easterly; Yarmouth church, S.E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  S.; Sconce point, W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  N.; Hurst high lighthouse, W. by N.  $\frac{3}{4}$  N.; Lympington church, North; and Hamsted ledge buoy East. There are only 6 feet at low water about 47 yards inside the buoy.

*Hamsted Ledge.*

The *white* buoy on this ledge has been moved rather more than  $1\frac{1}{4}$  cables to the north-eastward, and now lies in 5 fathoms on the north-east end of the ledge, with North close farm house in line with North beacon at entrance of Newtown river, S.E. by E.  $\frac{3}{4}$  E.; Egypt point E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  N. (Gurnet buoy is nearly on with the point); Pitts Deep coast-guard houses, N. by W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  W.; Lympington church, N.W.; Hurst high lighthouse, W.  $\frac{3}{4}$  N.; Sconce point, West, northerly; and the highest part of the Mount trees at Yarmouth just southward of the south part of Hill trees, W.  $\frac{3}{4}$  S.

## NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 20.)—NORWAY—WEST COAST.

The Royal Norwegian Marine Department at Christiania has given notice, that on and after the 1st day of September, 1862, the following lights will be established on the west coast of Norway.

*Light at Buholmen.*

A *fixed* white light will be exhibited from the north side of Buholmen, at the northern entrance to Brönösund, visible from the northward when bearing between S. by W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  W. and W. by N.  $\frac{3}{4}$  N., and from the southward between N.E. by N. and E. by S.  $\frac{3}{4}$  S. It is placed at an elevation of 42 feet above the mean level of the sea, and should be seen in clear weather from a distance of 10 miles. The position of the light is lat. 65° 28' 30" N., long. 12° 13' 30" East of Greenwich.

When approaching Brönsund from the northward or southward, by keeping the light in sight, a vessel will clear all dangers. In approaching from the northward and being westward of Salhusrogn, the light should not be brought to bear more southerly than S. by W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W., when a vessel should steer for it until the entrance westward of Buholmen is seen; then with the light on port side steer S.W. into the sound. The light will be shown from the 15th day of August to the 1st day of May.

*Light at Reine.*

Also, that a *fixed* white light will be exhibited from the southern point of Olenilsöens island, at the entrance to Reine harbour, visible when bearing from W. by S. round north and east to S. by E. It is placed at an elevation of 41 feet above the mean level of the sea, and should be seen from a distance of 6 miles. The position of the light is lat.  $67^{\circ} 55' 50''$  N., long  $13^{\circ} 8' 30''$  East of Greenwich.

The channel between Lamholm and Langskjær islands will be open when the light bears between N.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E. and N.N.E. This passage as well as that northward of Langskjær is clear of danger. In entering a vessel should keep westward of the light and between it and the Fiskeskjærene rocks lying about  $1\frac{1}{4}$  cables W.N.W. of the light. There is good anchorage everywhere in the bay as well as close inside Langskjær and Lamholm. The light will be shown from the 1st day of September to the 14th day of April.

*Light at Orsvaag.*

Also, that a *fixed* white light will be shown from the north-east side of Sagöen island, at the entrance to Orsvaag harbour, visible when bearing from E.N.E. round north and west to S.E. It is placed at an elevation of 92 feet above the mean level of the sea, and should be seen from a distance of 6 miles. The latitude of the light is  $68^{\circ} 11' 40''$  N., long.  $14^{\circ} 27'$  East of Greenwich.

The usual and best anchorage is with the light bearing S. by W. About  $1\frac{1}{2}$  cables N. by W. of the light is a sunken rock with 9 feet over it, at low water. The light will be shown from the 1st day of September to the 14th day of April.

**NOTICE TO MARINERS.**

(No. 21.)—NORWAY—WEST COAST.

THE Royal Norwegian Marine Department at Christiana has given notice, that on and after the 1st day of September, 1862, the following lights will be established on the west coast of Norway.

*Light at Hjertholmen.*

A *fixed* white light will be exhibited from the east side of Hjertholmen, at the entrance to the harbour of Lödingens (Roholmens), visible when bearing from S.W.  $\frac{3}{4}$  S., round west and north to N.E. by N. It will be elevated 67 feet above the mean level of the sea, and should be seen from a distance of 10 or 12 miles. The lat. of the light is  $68^{\circ} 24' 40''$  N., long.  $16^{\circ} 3'$  East of Greenwich.

The light bearing N.E. by N. will lead a cable eastward of the Rotvær rocks, as well as clear of Smälrumpen and Smalen. The light bearing S.W.  $\frac{3}{4}$  S. will lead about three-quarters of a cable eastward of Strandodden, and also clears the Falken rock.

Vessels should pass eastward of Hjertholmen, which is clear of dangers on the north and east sides, to the distance of half a cable from the land, with the exception of Havnescallen bank, over which there are 16 feet of water at low tide, lying about 3 cables N.E. by N., from the light. The light will be shown from the 15th day of August, to the 1st day of May.

*Light at Fladholmen.*

Also that a *fixed* white light will be exhibited from the north-west point of Fladholmen, eastward of Rot, visible when bearing from S.W. by W., westerly, round by south and east to N.E. by N. It is placed at an elevation of 43 feet above the mean level of the sea, and should be seen from a distance of 8 miles. Its position is lat.  $58^{\circ} 55' 18''$  N., long.  $5^{\circ} 33' 40''$  East of Greenwich.

There is good anchorage in 9 or 10 fathoms water, on the east side of Fladholmen, between it and Staholmen. Steer northward of Fladholmen, which is clear of dangers at a distance of about 10 fathoms from the land.

*Light on Tungenæs Point.*

Also that a *fixed* white light will be exhibited about 500 yards north-westward of the old lighthouse on Tungenæs point, about  $5\frac{1}{2}$  miles north-west of Stavanger. The light will be visible when bearing from E. to N.  $\frac{1}{4}$  N., round by south and west from the direction of Hundvaagöen.
