THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at Caracas, enclosing a copy of a Venezuelan Decree, of which the following is a translation, imposing additional customs' duties on articles imported into Venezuela:

DECREE.—ART. 1. The custom houses shall collect an additional duty of 25 per cent. on the ordinary customs dues, besides the 50 per cent. which are collected in virtue of existing dispositions.

ART. 2. The collection of the said 25 per cent. shall begin after 30 days for importations from the United States, and after 90 days for importations from Europe. These terms are to be reckoned from the day of publication in each custom house respectively.
