THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs copies of Despatches from Her Majesty's Consul in Honduras, enclosing copies of Laws recently passed by the Government of that Republic regulating, as follows, the payment of import and tonnage duties :

The existing import duty of 20 per cent. ad valorem on all articles except liquors is replaced by one on all articles, including liquors, of 6 per cent. ad valorem, payable in cash, to which is added 20 per cent. ad valorem, payable in Government Bonds (the latter at the present market price representing only 31 per cent. in cash.)

Every merchant vessel which anchors in the northern ports of the Republic shall pay one real (6d.) for every ton measurement up to 400 tons, above which each ton will be charged at one included in this charge.

T the October General Quarter Sessions of the Peace of our Sovereign Lady the Queen, held at Northampton, in and for the county of Northampton, by adjournment, on Saturday, the 22nd day of November, in the 26th year of the reign of our Sovereign Lady Victoria, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Queen, Defender of the Faith, and in the year of our Lord 1862, before the Honourable Frederick William Child Villiers (Chairman), the Right Honourable the Earl Spencer, the Right Honourable the Lord Lyveden, the Right Honourable the Lord Henley, M.P., the Reverend Francis Litchfield, Clerk, and others, their Fellows, Justices of our said Lady the Queen, assigned to keep the peace in the county aforesaid, and also to hear and determine divers felonies, trespasses, and other misdeeds, done and committed within the same county (amongst other

Francis Litchfield (Clerk), and Alfred Rush, Esq., in the words or to the effect following, was,- on the 26th day of September last past, sent to the Clerk of the Peace for the said county of Northampton: (viz.)

- "To Henry Philip Markham, Esq., Clerk of the Peace for the county of Northampton.
 - ¹⁶ We, the undersigned, being five Justices of the Peace for the said county of Northampton, acting for the division of Brackley, do, by this writing under our hands, require you, the said Henry Philip Markham, as Clerk of the Peace of the said county, to add to, or send with the notice required by law, to be given of the holding of Courts of General Quarter Sessions, a notice that at the Court of General Quarter Sessions for the said county, to be holden at Northampton, in the said county, on Wednesday, the 15th day of October next, a proposal will be made to the Justices then and there assembled, to divide the said county of Northampton into Highway Districts.
 - "Given under our hands this 24th day of September, 1862.
 - "P. S. Pierrepont, Chairman of Petty "Sessions, Brackley.
 - " J. L. Statton,
 - " C. A. Sage,
 - " F. Litchfield.
 - " Alfred Rush."

"And whereas the said Clerk of the Peace did. in pursuance of the requisition above-mentioned, send with the notice required by law of the holding of the Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the said county; on the said 15th day of October last past, a notice, in the form marked A in the Schedule to the Act of Parliament, passed in the 25th and 26th years of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled 'An Act for the better management of Highways in England,' or as near thereto as circumstances would admit, that at the said Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the said county, to be held on the said 15th day of October last past, as aforesaid, a proposal would be made to divide the county of Northampton into Highway Districts; and whereas at the said General Quarter Sessions of No. 22687.

the Peace, held in and for the said county, on the said 15th day of October last past, a proposal was made by five Magistrates acting in and for the said county, to divide the said county into Highway Districts; and whereas the consideration of the said proposal was deferred until the same had been submitted to a Committee, who were requested to report thereon to the said October General Quarter Sessions of the Peace, to be held, by adjournment, on this present 22nd day of November instant;

"And whereas the report of the said Committee of Justices was made to the Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the said county of Northampton, held on this said 22nd day of November instant. Now, therefore, this Court doth order that the county of Northampton, with the exception of the liberty of Peterborough, the boroughs of Northampton and Daventry, and the towns of Wellingborough and Oundle, shall be divided into Ten Highway Districts, and which shall be called the Districts hereinafter mentioned, (that is to say) :—

> The Brackley District, The Weedon District, The Kettering District, The Little Bowden District, The Brixworth District, The Hardingstone District, The Kingscliffe District, The Thrapston District, The Towcester District, and The Irthlingborough District.

"And that the Highway Board for each of such districts shall hold their first meetings at the several places hereinafter mentioned, that is to say, for the Brackley District, at Brackley; for the Weedon District, at Weedon; for the Kettering District, at Kettering; for the Little Bowden District, at Little Bowden; for the Brixworth District, at Brixworth; for the Hardingstone District, at Hardingstone; for the Kingscliffe District, at Kingscliffe; for the Thrapston District, at Thrapston; for the Irthlingborough District, at Irthlingborough.
