THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs copies of Despatches from Her Majesty's Consul in Honduras, enclosing copies of Laws recently passed by the Government of that Republic regulating, as follows, the payment of import and tonnage duties:

The existing import duty of 20 per cent. ad valorem on all articles except liquors is replaced by one on all articles, including liquors, of 6 per cent. ad valorem, payable in cash, to which is added 20 per cent. ad valorem, payable in Government Bonds (the latter at the present market price representing only 3½ per cent. in cash.)

Every merchant vessel which anchors in the northern ports of the Republic shall pay one real (6d.) for every ton measurement up to 400 tons, above which each ton will be charged at one
