THE following Addresses of Congratulation to the Queen, on the attainment of his Majority by His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, having been transmitted to the Right Honourable Sir George Grey, Baronet, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, for Presentation, have accordingly been presented by him to Her Majesty, who has been pleased to receive the same very graciously :

Unto the **QUEEN'S** Most Excellent Majesty.

May it please your Majesty,

WE, your Majesty's most faithful and devoted subjects, the Ministers and Elders of the Church of Scotland, in Commission of the General Assembly convened, desire to approach your Majesty's throne with the expression of our sincere congratulations upon occasion of His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales attaining his majority.

It is to us matter of joy and thankfulness that it has pleased Divine Providence to spare His Royal Highness, as well as your other children, to be a comfort to your Majesty under the severe bereavement with which it pleased Almighty God lately to visit you and the Royal Family, and also, as we confidently trust, to prove a solace and support to your Majesty under the manifold cares and anxieties incident to the Sovereign of this mighty empire.

We are more especially led to feel that, amid the countless benefits of your reign, your Majesty's domestic virtues constitute a peculiar claim on the affection and gratitude of all classes and races within the limits of your vast dominions.

It is our earnest prayer that His Royal Highness may be enabled faithfully to copy the bright example which has been set him by his illustrious parents ; that he may be adorned with all those princely virtues and Christian graces which render kings objects of respect and affection to their subjects, and by which their thrones are established in righteousness ; and that when it shall please the Supreme Disposer of Events to call your Majesty away from this temporal kingdom to that which is heavenly and eternal, the crown which you have so adorned may descend upon one who

is altogether worthy to wear it ; and that, treading in your steps, he may enjoy the same ardent loyalty and affection which your subjects entertain universally for your Majesty's person and government.

In the Prince of Wales we cannot but take a most peculiar interest ; he is more immediately destined, though we earnestly trust at a far distant day, to exemplify, for the welfare and happiness of this great empire, those lessons of piety and virtue in which all the members of your family have been so faithfully reared ; and we hail with unalloyed delight the prospect of his soon entering, with your Majesty's consenting approval, on a state in which are involved issues momentous, not only for our country but for mankind.

That your Majesty may be long spared to reign over us, and that your family also may enjoy the favour of Almighty God, and may to many generations sit upon the throne of this great empire, is the sincere prayer of,

CONVENTION between Her Majesty and the King of the Belgians, relative to Joint Stock Companies.

Signed at London, November 13, 1862.

[Ratifications exchanged at London, December 8, 1862.]

HER Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and His Majesty the King of the Belgians, having judged it expedient to come to an understanding in order to define, within their respective dominions and possessions, the position of commercial, industrial, and financial Companies and Associations constituted and authorized in conformity with the laws in force in either of the two countries, have resolved to conclude a Convention for that purpose, and have named as their Plenipotentiaries, that is to say:—

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, the Right Honourable John Earl Russell, Viscount Amberley of Amberley and Ardsalla, a Peer of the United Kingdom, Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, a Member of Her Britannic Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, Her Britannic Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs; and the Right Honourable Thomas Milner Gibson, a Member of Her Britannic Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, a Member of Parliament, and President of the Committee of Privy Council for Affairs of Trade and Foreign Plantations;

And His Majesty the King of the Belgians, the Sieur Sylvain Van de Weyer, His Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary to Her Britannic Majesty, Grand Cross of the Order of Leopold, decorated with the Iron Cross, Grand Cross of the Order of Charles III of Spain, of the Order of the Ernestine Branch of Saxony, of the Tower and Sword, of St. Maurice and St. Lazarus, Commander of the Legion of Honour, &c.;

Who, after having communicated to each other their respective full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed upon the following Articles:—

ARTICLE I.

The High Contracting Parties declare that they mutually grant to all Companies and other Associations, commercial, industrial, or financial, constituted and authorized in conformity with the laws in force in either of the two countries, the power of exercising all their rights, and of appearing before the Tribunals, whether for the purpose of bringing an action, or for defending the same, throughout the dominions and possessions of the other Power, subject to the sole condition of conforming to the laws of such dominions and possessions.

ARTICLE II.

It is agreed that the stipulations of the preceding Article shall apply as well to Companies and Associations constituted and authorized previously to the signature of the present Convention, as to those which may subsequently be so constituted and authorized.

ARTICLE III.

The present Convention is concluded without limit as to duration. Either of the High Powers shall, however, be at liberty to terminate it by giving to the other a year's previous notice. The two High Powers, moreover, reserve to themselves the power to introduce into the Convention, by common consent, any modifications which experience may show to be desirable.

SA Majesté la Reine du Royaume Uni de la Grande Bretagne et d'Irlande, et Sa Majesté le Roi des Belges, ayant jugé utile de s'entendre, pour régulariser dans leurs Etats et Possessions respectifs la situation des Compagnies et Associations commerciales, industrielles, et financières, constituées et autorisées suivant les lois particulières à chacun des deux pays, ont résolu de conclure une Convention dans ce but, et ont muni à cet effet de leurs pleins pouvoirs, savoir:—

Sa Majesté la Reine du Royaume Uni de la Grande Bretagne et d'Irlande, le Très Honorable Jean Comte Russell, Vicomte Amberley de Amberley et Ardsalla, Pair du Royaume Uni, Chevalier du Très Noble Ordre de la Jarretière, Membre du Très Honorable Conseil Privé de Sa Majesté Britannique, Principal Secrétaire d'Etat de Sa Majesté Britannique pour les Affaires Etrangères; et le Très Honorable Thomas Milner Gibson, Membre du Très Honorable Conseil Privé de Sa Majesté Britannique, Membre du Parlement, et Président du Comité du Conseil Privé pour les Affaires de Commerce et des Colonies;

Et Sa Majesté le Roi des Belges, le Sieur Sylvain Van de Weyer, Son Envoyé Extraordinaire et Ministre Plenipotentiare près Sa Majesté Britannique, Grand-Croix de l'Ordre de Léopold, décoré de la Croix de Fer, Grand-Croix de l'Ordre de Charles III d'Espagne, de l'Ordre de la Branche Ernestine de Saxe, de la Tour et de l'Epée, de St. Maurice et St. Lazare, Commandeur de la Légion d'Honneur, &c.;

Lesquels, après s'être réciproquement communiqué leurs pleins pouvoirs respectifs, trouvés en bonne et due forme, sont convenus des Articles suivants:—

ARTICLE I.

Les Hautes Parties Contractantes déclarent reconnaître mutuellement à toutes les Compagnies et autres Associations commerciales, industrielles, ou financières, constituées et autorisées suivant les lois particulières à l'un des deux pays, la faculté d'exercer tous leurs droits, et d'ester en justice devant les Tribunaux, soit pour intenter une action, soit pour y défendre, dans toute l'étendue des Etats et Possessions de l'autre Puissance, sans autre condition que de se conformer aux lois des dits Etats et Possessions.

ARTICLE II.

Il est entendu que la disposition qui précède s'applique aussi bien aux Compagnies et Associations constituées et autorisées antérieurement à la signature de la présente Convention, qu'à celles qui le seraient ultérieurement.

ARTICLE III.

La présente Convention est faite sans limitation de durée. Toutefois, il sera loisible à l'une des deux Hautes Puissances Contractantes de la faire cesser en la dénonçant un an à l'avance. Les deux Hautes Puissances Contractantes se réservent d'ailleurs la faculté d'introduire, d'un commun accord, dans cette Convention les modifications dont l'utilité serait démontrée par l'expérience.

ARTICLE IV.

The present Convention shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at London in one month, or sooner if possible.

DECLARATIONS exchanged between the Governments of Great Britain and of Bavaria, relative to the duties payable on the withdrawal of the property of subjects of the one country from the territories of the other :

BRITISH DECLARATION.

THE undersigned, Her Britannic Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary at the Court of His Majesty the King of Bavaria, being duly authorized by his Government, hereby declares that the subjects of His Majesty the King of Bavaria are at liberty to withdraw their property from the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and from the British colonies and possessions, without being called upon to pay any duty as aliens on the withdrawal of it, and without paying any other duty than such as the subjects of Her Britannic Majesty are equally liable to pay.

In witness whereof the undersigned has signed the present Declaration, which is to be substituted for the Declaration of the 30th April, 1836, and has affixed thereto the seal of his arms.

BAVARIAN DECLARATION.

Sa Majesté le Roi de Bavière, Comte Palatin du Rhin, Duc de Bavière, de Franconie et en Souabe, &c., ayant eu connaissance que d'après les lois en vigueur dans le Royaume Uni de la Grande Bretagne et d'Irlande, et dans les Colonies et Possessions Britanniques, il ne se perçoit aucun droit quelconque à raison de l'exportation et du transfert des héritages et autres propriétés appartenant à des sujets Bavaois, le Soussigné, Ministre d'Etat ayant le Département de la Maison du Roi et des Affaires Etrangères, déclare par ces présentes, au nom du Gouvernement de Sa Majesté, qu'aucune retenue ne sera désormais exercée sous le titre de droit d'aubaine ou de déduction sur les héritages et autres biens échus en Bavière à des sujets de Sa Majesté Britannique soit dans la Royaume Uni, soit dans les Colonies et Possessions Britanniques, et que l'abolition de ces droits en faveur de ceux-ci aura son plein et entier effet, non seulement dans tous les cas à venir, tant que les lois ne seront pas changées à cet égard dans le Royaume Uni et dans les colonies et possessions Britanniques, mais encore dans tous ceux où, jusqu'au jour de la signature du présent Acte, les droits ainsi abolis n'auront pas effectivement et définitivement été perçus.

En foi de quoi, cette Déclaration, destinée à remplacer la Déclaration du 10 Avril, 1836, et à être échangée contre une Déclaration semblable de la part du Gouvernement de Sa Majesté Britannique, assurant une parfaite réciprocité aux sujets Bavaois, a été délivrée par le Ministre d'Etat Soussigné, et munie du sceau de ses armes.

His Majesty the King of Bavaria, Count Palatine of the Rhine, Duke of Bavaria, of Franconia, and in Suabia, &c., having learnt that, according to the laws in force in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and in the British colonies and possessions, no duty whatever is collected on the exportation and transfer of inheritances and other property belonging to Bavarian subjects, the undersigned Minister of State for the Department of the Royal House and for Foreign Affairs, declares by these presents, in the name of His Majesty's Government, that no deduction shall henceforth be made under the title of *droit d'aubaine ou de déduction*, upon inheritances and other property in Bavaria belonging to subjects of Her Britannic Majesty, whether in the United Kingdom or in the British colonies and possessions; and that the abolition of such duties in favour of those subjects shall have its full and entire effect, not only in all future cases, so long as the laws shall not be changed in this respect in the United Kingdom and in the British colonies and possessions, but also in all those cases in which, up to the date of the signature of the present Act, the duties thus abolished shall not have been actually and definitely collected.

In witness whereof this Declaration, destined to be substituted for the Declaration of the 10th of April, 1836, and to be exchanged against a similar Declaration on the part of the Government of Her Britannic Majesty, securing perfect reciprocity to Bavarian subjects, has been delivered by the undersigned Minister of State, and sealed with the seal of his Arms.

And whereas we, as Commissioners for executing the office of Lord High Admiral of the United Kingdom, find it necessary for the protection of, and providing free access and egress to and from, the Tower Arsenal Wharf, on the River Thames, to prohibit any merchant vessel, lighter, barge, boat, or other craft from being moored within 150 feet of high water mark from the Tower Wharf, between Iron Gate Stairs, on the east, and Queen's Stairs, on the west, and further to prohibit any steam vessels or other class of large vessels being moored within 270 feet of the high-water mark of the Tower Wharf, between the Iron Gate Stairs and Queen's Stairs aforesaid, such portion of the intermediate space, between the above-named distances, as lies to the eastward of a red mark upon the wharf-wall opposite to the drawbridge to the east of Traitors' Gate, to be used by small vessels of a class similar to those now in the habit of using it, and to which the Constable of the Tower, or his deputy, or other officers, may not object; and the remaining portion, lying to the westward of such red mark, to be kept entirely clear, the mooring, &c., of the small vessels in question, within such eastern space, to be regulated by the Harbour Master of the River Thames.
