ORDER REGULATING THE USE OF LOCOMOTIVES WITHIN THE BOROUGH OF CAMBRIDGE.

WHEREAS it appears to me, the Right Honourable Sir George Grey, Bart., one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, that the use of Locomotives unless restricted, as hereinafter mentioned, on any highway within the limits of the borough of Cambridge, is dangerous and inconvenient to the public:

I hereby do, by virtue of the provisions of "The Locomotive Act, 1861," by this Order, under my hand, prohibit the use of any kind of Locomotive whatever propelled by steam or any other than animal power on the highways within the limits of the borough of Cambridge, at any time except between the hours of nine at night and seven in the morning.
