

Now, therefore, we, the Poor Law Board, under the authority of the several Statutes in that behalf made and provided, hereby order and direct as follows; that is to say:—

ARTICLE I.—That so much of the said Act, passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty, as relates to the providing of a room or suitable buildings for the purpose of holding vestry or other meetings for the transaction of any business of, or relating to, the said parish of Tottenham, shall forthwith be applied to and be put in force within the said parish.

ARTICLE II.—That a copy of this Order shall be published in the London Gazette.
