ORDER REGULATING THE USE OF LOCOMOTIVES ON OR ALONG THE BIDDENDEN TO BOUNDGATE, AND THE STOCKERSHEAD TO BAGHAM'S CROSS TURNPIKE ROADS, IN THE COUNTY OF KENT.

WHEREAS it appears to me, the Right Honourable Sir George Grey, Baronet, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, that the use of Locomotives, unless restricted as hereinafter mentioned, on or along the Biddenden to Boundgate, and the Stockershead to Bagham's Cross Turnpike Roads, in the county of Kent, is dangerous and inconvenient to the public.

I do hereby, by virtue of the provisions of "The Locomotive Act, 1861," by this Order, under my hand, prohibit the use of any kind of Locomotive whatever propelled by steam, or any other than animal power, on the Turnpike Roads from Biddenden to Boundgate, and Stockershead to Bagham's Cross, in the county of Kent, except between the hours of nine at night and eight in the morning

WHEREAS the population of the parish of Aldershot, in the county of Southampton, according to the last census, exceeds two thousand persons.

And whereas at a meeting held at the Vestry of the Church of the said parish, after public notice in that behalf, on Saturday, the 6th day of April, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, it was resolved,—

“That an application be made to the Poor Law Commissioners to make an Order, under the provisions of the Statute 13th and 14th Victoria, chap. 57, sect. 1, that such Act, or part of it, should be applied and put in force within this parish, in order to enable the Vestry to appoint a fit and proper person as Vestry Clerk.”

ARTICLE I.—That so much of the said Act passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty, as relates to the appointment of a Vestry Clerk, shall forthwith be applied to and put in force within the said parish of Aldershot.

ARTICLE II.—That an annual salary of twenty-five pounds shall be paid to the Vestry Clerk for the time being, appointed under the authority of the Statutes in that behalf and this Order, by the Overseers of the Poor of the said parish.

ARTICLE III.—That the salary of such Vestry Clerk shall be payable up to the day on which he ceases to hold such office, and no longer, and shall be paid by quarterly payments at the several quarters ending at the usual feast days in the year, namely, Lady Day, Midsummer Day, Michaelmas Day, and Christmas Day, with a proportionate sum to be paid to his executors or administrators in case he shall die while holding such office.

**A**T a Special General Session holden at Maidstone, in and for the county of Kent, on Tuesday, the 20th day of January, in the twenty-sixth year of the reign of our Sovereign Lady Victoria, by the grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Queen, Defender of the Faith, in pursuance of an Act of Parliament passed in the forty-second year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, "for enabling the Justices of the Peace for the county of Kent to hold a General Session annually or oftener, for levying and applying the rates and expenditure of the said county, and to alter and amend an Act passed in the forty-ninth year of His Majesty for regulating the rates of the said county," pursuant to a requisition under the hands and seals of five of Her Majesty's Justices of the Peace for the said county, for the purpose of considering a proposal to divide the said county of Kent into Highway Districts, under the provisions of the Act of the 25th and 26th Vict., cap. 61, entitled "An Act for the better Management of Highways in England," excepting only such portions of the county as by the restrictions contained in the said last-mentioned Act may be excluded from its operation, and, upon such proposal being entertained for the purpose of making a Provisional Order dividing the said county into Highway Districts with the exception aforesaid; the same being an emergency requiring such immediate attention as to render the holding of such special session necessary.
