WHEREAS in the Act of Uniformity, which established the Liturgy of the Church of England, provision is made for such alterations in the Prayers for the Royal Family as from time to time shall become necessary, and be directed by lawful authority; it is, thereupon, this day ordered in Council, that in the Morning and Evening Prayers, in the Litany, and in all other parts of the Public Service, as well in the occasional offices as in the Book of Common Prayer, where the Royal Family is appointed to be particularly prayed for, the following form and order shall be observed:

“ Albert Edward, Prince of Wales, the Princess of Wales, and all the Royal Family.”

And it is further ordered, that no edition of the Common Prayer be from henceforth printed but with this amendment; and that in the meantime, and until copies of such edition may be had, all Parsons, Vicars, and Curates within this realm do (for the preventing of mistakes), with the pen, correct and amend all such prayers in their Church Books, according to the foregoing direction: And for the better notice hereof, that this Order be forthwith printed and published, and sent to the several parishes; and that the Right Reverend the Bishops do take care that obedience be paid to the same accordingly.

Revolving Light on Cabo de Gata.

THE Minister of Marine at Madrid has given notice, that on and after the 30th day of April, 1863, a light will be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected at Cabo de Gata, on the South Coast of Spain.

The light will be a revolving white light, attaining its greatest brilliancy every half-minute. It is placed at an elevation of 194 feet above the mean level of the sea, and should be seen in clear weather from a distance of 19 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the second order.

The tower is 60 feet high, white, and rises from the centre of the circular battery of the Castle of Corraletes, which stands on the extremity of the cape, distant 50 yards from the sea. It is in lat. 36° 43' 36" N., long. 2° 14' 10" West of Greenwich. At rather more than half a mile S. $\frac{1}{4}$ E. from the lighthouse is a sunken rock with 9 feet water over it.

Fixed Light at Villaricos.

Also, that on and after the 30th day of April, 1863, a light will be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected at Villaricos, in the province of Almeria.

The light will be a fixed white light, placed at an elevation of 63 feet above the mean level of the sea, and should be seen in clear weather at a distance of 9 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the fifth order.

The tower is round, 30 feet high, white, attached to the keeper's dwelling, and stands $1\frac{1}{2}$ cables from the beach, northward of the Rio Almanzora. It is said to be in lat. 37° 11' 20" N., long. 1° 52' 46" West of Greenwich, or about 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ miles South, 4' West of that of the Admiralty Charts.

Fixed Light at Altea.

Also, that on and after the 30th day of April, 1863, a light will be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected at Altea, in the province of Alicante.

The light will be a *fixed* white light, placed at an elevation of 367 feet above the mean level of the sea, and should be seen in clear weather from a distance of 9 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the fifth order.

The tower is round, 28 feet high, white, and attached to the keeper's dwelling. It stands on Albir point 24 yards S.E. of the tower of Bombarda, at about eleven yards from the sea, in lat. $38^{\circ} 33' 30''$ N., long. $0^{\circ} 3' 58''$ West of Greenwich, or about 1' west of that of the Admiralty Charts.

ISLAND OF MINORCA.

Fixed Light at Puerto de Ciudadela.

Also, that on and after the 30th day of April, 1863, a light will be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected at Puerto de Ciudadela, at the west end of the island of Minorca.

The light will be a *fixed* white light, placed at an elevation of 66 feet above the mean level of the sea, and should be seen in clear weather from a distance of 7 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the sixth order.

The tower is slightly conical, 36 feet high, coloured dark grey, surmounted by a white lantern, and rises from the centre of the keeper's dwelling. It stands on Punta Enderocat, at the west side of entrance to the port, about 6 yards from the sea, in lat. $39^{\circ} 59' 45''$ N., long. $3^{\circ} 51' 45''$ East of Greenwich.

When coming from the westward and being near the shore, the light is hidden by the highest part of Punta del Buey between the bearings of E.S.E. and S.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E.

Whereas, at the Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace held for the county of Dorset, at the County Hall, in Dorchester, in the said county, on the 5th day of January, 1863, before the Right Honourable Edward Berkeley Lord Portman (Chairman), John Floyer, Esq., and others, Justices of our said Lady the Queen, and continued by adjournment to the Town Hall, in Blandford Forum, in the said county, on the 28th day of the same month of January, and further continued by adjournment to the County-hall, in Dorchester aforesaid, on the 17th day of February then next following, a Provisional Order was duly made under the Highway Act, 25th and 26th Victoria, chapter 61, setting forth that the parishes, and parts of parishes, and places therein and hereinafter mentioned, should be united and formed into Highway Districts, under the names by which such districts are to be known, and the number of Waywardens which each of the parishes in such districts was to elect according to the directions of the said Act. And the said Provisional Order also stated the times and places at which the first meeting of the respective highway boards were to be held in each district.

And the said Provisional Order also stated, that where a parish, included in any or either of the districts therein and hereinafter formed, separately maintaining its own poor, is divided into townships, tythings, hamlets, or places, each of which separately maintains its own Highways, all such townships, tythings, hamlets, and places (saving those which are mentioned in this parenthesis, each of which being included by name in a Highway District as therein and hereinafter formed, is constituted a Parish, as defined by the said Act, and called "a Highway Parish" (that is to say), Outer Lillington (part of the parish of Lillington); Plush (part of the parish of Buckland Newton); Stoborough (part of the parish of the Holy Trinity, Wareham); the out-parishes of Lady St. Mary and St. Martin, Wareham; Benville and Mapper-ton (parts of the parish of Corscombe); Abbott-street, Barnsley, Cowgrove, Petersham, and West Stone (parts of the parish of Wimborne Minster); Milton and Feirson (a tything in the parish of Gillingham); Middlemarsh (part of the parish of Minterne Magna); Newland (part of the parish of Wootton Glanvilles); Waterson and Ilington (parts of the parish of Puddletown); Childhay, Dibberford, Drimpton, and Littlewinsor (parts of the parish of Broadwinsor); and also saving the outlying parts of the parish of Milton Abbas, called Holworth and Liscombe, as being tythings or places, are, by the said Provisional Order, annexed to a highway district), should be, and the same were thereby combined for the purposes of

the said Act with such poor law parish; and the said Justices did declare that no separate Waywardens should be elected for such combined townships, tythings, hamlets, and places; and that each of such combined parishes should be subject to the same liabilities in respect of all the highways within it, which have been heretofore maintained by such townships, tythings, hamlets, and places therein separately, as if all their several liabilities had attached to the whole parish; and that a Waywarden or Waywardens should be elected for each of such combined parishes as a whole.

And the said Provisional Order also stated, that where in any places named in either of the Highway Districts therein and hereinafter formed, there have heretofore been no surveyor or surveyors elected, a Waywarden or Waywardens, as therein and hereinafter mentioned, should be elected for such places, in the same manner, at the same time, and subject to the same power of appointment in the Justices in the event of no election taking place, as a surveyor or surveyors would have been required by law to be elected or appointed, if such places had maintained their own highways and heretofore appointed their own surveyor or surveyors.

And the said Provisional Order provided, that if in the enumeration of parishes as therein and hereinafter formed into Highway Districts, there should be included therein any parish or place, or part of a parish or place, the highways whereof are maintained under the provisions of any local turnpike or other Act of Parliament, such parish or place, or part of a parish or place so situate, should be deemed to be excluded from any or either of such Highway Districts, anything therein contained notwithstanding.

And the said Provisional Order also provided, that if in any or either of the districts therein and hereinafter formed there should be included therein any parish separately maintaining its own highways, which is situate partly in the county of Dorset and partly in another county, the whole of such parish should, for the purposes of the said Act, be deemed to be within that county within which the church of such parish, or if there be no church, the greater part of such parish is situate, anything therein contained to the contrary notwithstanding.

And whereas, the Justices making the said Provisional Order appointed the present Court of General Sessions for the taking into consideration the confirmation of such Provisional Order by a Final Order.

And whereas notice of the said Provisional Order has been duly given by the Clerk of the Peace by publishing a copy in the London Gazette of the 27th day of February, 1863, and in two newspapers circulating in this county, called The Dorset County Chronicle and Somersetshire Gazette, and The Sherborne, Dorchester, and Taunton Journal, of the 26th day of February, 1863, and by sending a copy to the overseers of every parish within the proposed districts; and there was added to the notice of the said provisional order the date of the sessions at which the confirmation of such Order would be considered, according to the directions of the said Act.

And whereas the Clerk of the Peace hath duly sent with the notice required by law to be given of the holding of Courts of General or Quarter Sessions, a notice in the Form marked B in the Schedule of the said Act, or as near thereto as circumstances admit, of the appointment so made by the Justices in relation to the confirmation of the said Provisional Order.

Now therefore, after duly considering the said Provisional Order, and hearing all objections thereto, the Justices assembled at these present Sessions (being the Court appointed for the confirmation of the same), do hereby confirm the said Provisional Order, with the following variations, viz. :—That the parishes of Whitchurch Canonicorum, Poorstock, and Netherbury, in the Bridport Highway District, hereinafter mentioned, shall each elect two Waywardens instead of one.

And this Court doth now accordingly make its Final Order in the premises as follows :—That, subject to the restrictions, regulations, and provisions mentioned in the said Act, the parishes and parts of parishes and places hereinafter enumerated shall be, and the same are, by this Final Order, united and formed into the nine following Highway Districts, for the purposes of the Highway Acts, such districts being constituted of the same parishes and places as are formed in and by the said Provisional Order, namely :—

WHEREAS at the General Quarter Sessions of the Peace, held at the Castle of Chester, in and for the county of Chester, on Monday, the 5th day of January, 1863, an Order was made as follows:—

This Court, pursuant to the provisions of an Act of Parliament made and passed in the session

of Parliament held in the 25th and 26th years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act for the better management of Highways in England," doth make a Provisional Order:

Secondly—That the several townships and places and parts of townships and places mentioned in the second schedule hereunder written, save and except such of the same townships and places and parts of townships and places (if any), as by the 7th section of the said Act are directed not to be included in any highway district, shall be a Highway District for the more convenient management of highways, and that such district shall be known by the name of "The Highway District of the Daresbury Division of the Hundred of Bucklow."

Thirdly—That the several townships and places and parts of townships and places mentioned in the third schedule hereunder written, save and except such of the same townships and places and parts of townships and places (if any), as by the 7th section of the said Act are directed not to be included in any highway district, shall be a Highway District for the more convenient management of highways, and that such district shall be known by the name of "The Highway District of the Hundred of Northwich."

Fourthly—That the several townships and places and parts of townships and places mentioned in the fourth schedule hereunder written, save and except such of the same townships and places and parts of townships and places (if any), as by the 7th section of the said Act are directed not to be included in any highway district, shall be a Highway District for the more convenient management of highways, and that such district shall be known by the name of "The Highway District of the East Division of the Hundred of Eddisbury."

Fifthly—That the several townships and places and parts of townships and places mentioned in the fifth schedule hereunder written, save and except such of the same townships and places and parts of townships and places (if any), as by the 7th section of the said Act are directed not to be included in any highway district, shall be a Highway District for the more convenient management of highways, and that such district shall be known by the name of "The Highway District of the West Division of the Hundred of Eddisbury."

Sixthly—That the several townships and places and parts of townships and places mentioned in the sixth schedule hereunder written, save and except such of the same townships and places and parts of townships and places (if any), as by the 7th section of the said Act are directed not to be included in any highway district, shall be a Highway District for the more convenient management of highways, and that such district shall be known by the name of "The Highway District of the Audlem Division of the Hundred of Nantwich."

Ninthly—That the several townships and places and parts of townships and places mentioned in the ninth schedule hereunder written, save and except such of the same townships and places and parts of townships and places (if any), as by the 7th section of the said Act are directed not to be included in any highway district, shall be a Highway District for the more convenient management of highways, and such district shall be known by the name of "The Highway District of the Stockport and Hyde Divisions of the Hundred of Macclesfield."

Eleventhly—That the several townships and places and parts of townships and places mentioned in the eleventh schedule hereunder written, save and except such of the same townships and places and parts of townships and places (if any), as by the 7th section of the said Act are directed not to be included in any highway district, shall be a Highway District for the more convenient management of highways, and that such district shall be known by the name of "The Highway District of the West Division of the Hundred of Broxton."

Twelfthly—That the several townships and places and parts of townships and places mentioned in the twelfth schedule hereunder written, save and except such of the same townships and places and parts of townships and places (if any), as by the 7th section of the said Act are directed not to be included in any highway district, shall be a Highway District for the more convenient management of highways, and that such district shall be known by the name of "The Highway District of the Hundred of Wirral."

And further—That one Waywarden shall be elected by each of the said several townships and places and parts of townships and places mentioned in the said several schedules hereunder written, save and except such of the same townships and places and parts of townships and places (if any), as by the 7th section of the said Act are directed not to be included in any highway district, and that, notwithstanding no surveyor or surveyors of highways were elected in any such townships and places and parts of townships and places previously to their forming part of a highway district.

And lastly—That in case any township mentioned in any of the said schedules, which sepa-

ately maintains its own poor, is divided into any tithings, hamlets, or places, each of which separately maintains its own highways, such tithings, hamlets, and places shall be combined, and no separate Waywarden shall be elected for such tithings, hamlets, and places, and such township shall be subject to the same liabilities in respect of all the highways within it which were before maintained by such tithings, hamlets, and places separately, as if all their several liabilities had attached to the whole township, and one Waywarden shall be elected for such township as a whole.

That the parishes of Bletsoe, Bolnhurst, Carlton, Chellington, Colmworth, Upper Dean, Lower Dean, Farndish, Felmersham, Harrold, Keysoe, Knotting, Melchbourn, Milton Ernest, Odell, Pavenham, Pertenhall, Puddington, Radwell, Risely, Sharnbrook, Shelton, Souldrop, Little Staughton, Thurlleigh, Tilbrook, Wymington and Yelden, should be united in the Highway District of Bletsoe, by the name of "the Bletsoe District."
