ARTICLE I.—That so much of the said Act, passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty, as relates to the providing of a room or suitable buildings for the purpose of holding vestry or other meetings for the transaction of any business of, or relating to, the said township of Dronfield, shall forthwith be applied to and be put in force within the said township.
