(No. 10.)-East Indies-Malacca Strait. Fixed Light on Cape Rachado.

THE Colonial Government at Singapore has given notice, that on or about the 1st day of February, 1863, a light would be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on Cape Rachado, in the Malacca Strait.

The light is a fixed white light, seen through an arc of 180°, or when bearing from S.E. by E. round by east and north to N.W. by W. The line of northern limit of the light passes over the centre of the Bambek shoal, and touches the extreme point to the north-westward, and nearly a mile south-west of the Diana rock to the southeastward. It is placed at an elevation of 446 feet above the mean level of the sea, and should be seen in clear weather from a distance of 20 miles. Between the bearings of S.E. by E. 2 E. and
